# Virginia's Hand Punches Out UNC

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. - Chris Williams scored six straight points dur-ing a go-ahead 13-4 second-half run Tuesday night, and Donald Hand got hot when it counted as Virginia held off No. 21 North

Men's Basketball Carolina 87-85. The victory

was the 300th of Pete Gillen's coaching career, and came with the Cavaliers (12-5, 3-2 ACC) playing the ball-hawking, up-tempo style he favors

North Carolina (11-7, 2-2) was forced into 21 turnovers that led to 29 points for the Cavaliers, dooming the Tar Heels into their third consecutive loss. The end didn't come easily as North

Williams led Virginia with 24 points, including six straight when the Cavaliers turned a 53-50 deficit into a 56-55 lead. Travis Watson added 17 points, Adam Hall had 14, and Hand finished with 12. All of Hand's points came in the final 7:15

The Tar Heels led 43-38 at halftime, getting the lead by scoring the final seven points. Earlier, North Carolina had runs of 10-0 and 11-0 but never led by more than eight because Virginia countered with 17-4 and 8-0 runs.

North Carolina also outrebounded the Cavaliers 23-14 in the opening 20 minutes and shot 62 percent to Virginia's 43 percent. But the home team made up for it by forcing 12 turnovers and outscoring the Tar Heels 16-4 off miscues.

duce these young neen. Clearly, they to be heard. While on an American sprang from the same mixture of DNA





A person may notice details that others don't notice, make c between unrelated events, or have clairvoyant or frequents deja vu experiences. For example, a person may find that a particular color keeps ming up in many otherwise unrelated circumstances, and then think that this has a special meaning in his/her life.

#### · WORRYING THAT OTHERS ARE TALKING ABOUT YOU. SUSPICIOUSNESS:

A person may have the feeling that people in a group are talking about, mocking or laughing at them, even though they realize that this may not be true. A person may suspect that others are harassing, trying to harm or cheat them

#### • TROUBLE THINKING OR CONCENTRATING:

A person may experience trouble keeping their thoughts together, jumping from one thought to another, have confused thinking, or problems with distraction, for example, "noticing every little thing."

#### • SOCIAL WITHDRAWAL:

A person may spend much less time with friends and family, may be harder to engage in social interactions, or be increasingly uncomfortable around other people.
