coach Dick Vermeil, who returned to coaching in 1997 after a 14-year absence. He had lost his only other Super Bowl appearance in 1981 with Philadelphia. The Rams outgained the Titans 294 yards to 89 in the first half but led just 9-0. The first three possessions ended with field-goal attempts and the Rams holding a 3-0 lead. St. Louis took the opening kickoff and drove from its own 31 to the Titans 17. But holder Mike Horan fumbled the snap on what would have been a 35-yard field-goal attempt. The Titans then moved to the St.

Louis 26 on a 32-yard screen pass from McNair to George. But Del Greco missed a 47-yard field goal. Warner then hit two quick passes, 32 yards to Torry Holt and 17 to Marshall Faulk. But that drive stalled at the 9, and Jeff Wilkins hit a 27-yard field goal to give St. Louis the lead. The Titans kept the Rams out of the end zone again after St. Louis drove 73

yards from its own 16 to the Tennessee 11. This time Wilkins ended up kicking a 29-yard field goal to make it 6-0. The Rams then went 67 yards in 13 plays but ended up again with just a field goal, a 29-yarder by Wilkins. The Titans reached the St. Louis 27 on the opening possession of the second half, but Del Greco's 47-yard field-goal attempt was blocked by Todd Lyght. The Rams followed the block with a 68-yard, eight-play drive for the game's first TD. It came two plays after the game was delayed while Titans safety Blaine Bishop was treated for a strained neck. On third-and-goal from the 9, Holt slid inside of Dainon Sidney and Warner sidearmed the ball to him through the Tennessee pass rush and it was 16-0.

UNC Caps Undefeated Start By Blasting No. 5 Hurricanes

The 20th-ranked North Carolina baseball team finished off a perfect weekend by defeating No. 5 Miami 9-0 Sunday in the ACC/Disney Blast. UNC (3-0) broke open a scoreless game by scoring two runs in the bottom of the fifth inning. The Tar Heels registered two runs in the sixth and one more in the seventh to take a 5-0 lead. Ryan Blake blasted a two-run home run in a four-run eighth inning. Chris Elmore (1-0) provided seven scoreless innings and allowed only four hits. "It's January, and we just have to keep that in mind," UNC coach Mike Fox said. "It's a little unexpected to come out and do this well."

On Saturday, the Tar Heels garnered an 8-2 win against seventh-ranked Rice. North Carolina broke a 2-2 tie by scoring six runs in the top of the ninth. Blake hit a triple to right-center field

to drive in two runs and give UNC a 4-2 cushion. He later stole home. UNC's Scott Autrey (1-0) picked up the win in his first collegiate pitching appearance with 2 2/3 innings of scoreless relief.

On Friday, North Carolina rallied to knock off 23rd-ranked Central Florida 9-6.

The Tar Heels scored seven of their nine runs in the fifth and sixth innings. UNC freshmen Adam Greenberg, Chad Prosser and Russ Adams combined to go 6-for-9 at the plate.

UNC Swimmers Sweep Maryland

The North Carolina swimming and diving teams returned to the win column Saturday afternoon, sweeping dual meets from Maryland by virtually identical scores at the Campus Recreation Center Natatorium in College Park, Md. The 17th-ranked UNC women's team defeated the Terps 181-119, while the 20th-ranked men's team recorded a 180-118 victory. The UNC men (6-3, 3-1 in the ACC) won 11 of 16 events, led by sophomore Chris Helin and junior Brad Kline.

Helin won the 100-yard breaststroke, 200-yard breaststroke and the 200-yard individual medley. Kline captured two events, winning the 200-yard freestyle and the 500-yard freestyle.

The UNC women (8-2, 3-1) also won 11 events, with Katie Hathaway and Ashley Benner both earning two wins.

Under the Weather

Weather conditions forced postponements for UNC's women's tennis, fencing, wrestling, men's tennis and track and field teams this weekend.

The Tar Heels' women's tennis match against Richmond, which was scheduled for Saturday, was postponed and will be rescheduled at a later date.

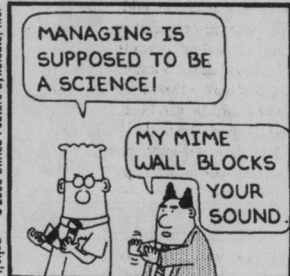
UNC's fencing team did not travel to Philadelphia for the Penn Dual Meets because of weather conditions and flight cancellations.

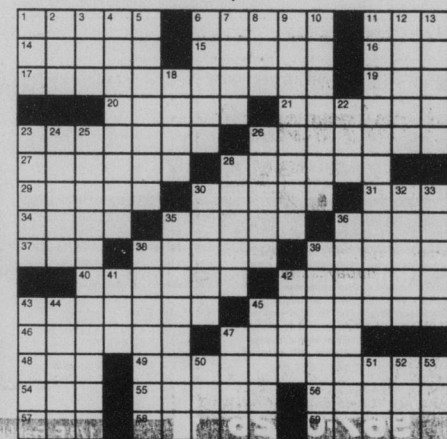
