Teasley Provides Spark for Tar Heels

Playing for the first time since Jan. 3, Tar Heel point quard Nikki Teasley scored 11 second-half points.

With 6:31 remaining against Maryland on Sunday in Carmichael Auditorium, North Carolina's Nikki Teasley made her return to the women's basketball team official.

Trailing 43-40, UNC coach Sylvia

Hatchell re-inserted the junior point

guard into the lineup for crunch time.

On the first possession coming out of the timeout, Teasley elevated above Terrapin defender Tiffany Brown on a driving pull-up jumper from 15 feet. As the official's whistle blew to signal a foul on Brown, Teasley's shot dropped through the net off the glass.

Teasley, who has not played with the team since Jan. 3, successfully converted on the 3-point play to knot the score and spark a 14-6 UNC run to finish the

Less than two minutes later, Teasley found Juana Brown spotting up for a 3-pointer in the left corner that give the Tar Heels a lead they would not relin-

In those final six-plus minutes of the game, Teasley scored five points, dished out two assists, drew a foul off the drib-ble, caused a Maryland traveling violation and snagged a rebound.

"I really felt like at the end we ele

vated and really played like our old selves," Hatchell said. "It's nice to have

The Tar Heels were more relaxed and confident on offense with Teasley running the show again.

"I thought she did a good job setting us up, getting us organized and getting the ball to the right people where we were open," Hatchell said.

Teasley did display some signs of rust, particularly in the first half. She ed all five of her field goal attempts and had two turnovers to go with her With the shot clock winding down

about midway through the first half, Teasley took matters into her own hands from the top of the key. Attempting to dribble behind her back three times, she lost control of the ball while driving to the paint and fell to the floor. Renneika Razor then converted a transition layup on the other end for Maryland.

Teasley regained her composure at the half and finished the afternoon with 11 points (5-of-14 shooting), six rebounds, five assists and three turnovers. She failed to convert any of her four 3-point attempts.

However, Juana Brown made it clear

that Teasley's impact could not be measured in the box score alone. Teasley's return provided an emotional lift in addition to the boost in talent an All-

ACC performer brings.
"Nikki provides a spark out there,"
Brown said. "She gets hyped off making great passes and scoring, and it carries to the rest of the team.

"That was something we really needed – a good spark – because our confidence wasn't like it used to be, and (having) her out there kind of added something to our attitude."

Whatever Teasley's troubles were

that kept her away from the team for three weeks, she says she's a stronger person because of them and she's glad to be back.

"It's been very challenging," Teasley said. "A lot of things have been going on, and not playing basketball, I've had a lot of free time to just think about some things that I want to do as far as my life and situation."

Now that Teasley is back on the court, the Tar Heels are looking to get back on track and go through the second half of the conference schedule with more success than they experienced the first time

The players said the win against Maryland was an important first step in that direction.

Said Teasley, "Hopefully, this can be a start of a great winning streak.
