North Carolina senior shortstop with three hits and Rams on the base three runs batted in Cory Bauswell, who was on first,

rounded second base too far on Elrod's single and was thrown out as he scampered back, snuffing out the rally. In the bottom of the inning, UNC

pushed across a run when the Rams thought they were in the comfort zone. Hooper came to bat with two outs

and Adam Greenberg on first base. He

Greenberg, who had walked, to steal second and move into scoring position. Then, with a full count, the senior shortstop singled to right field to push the lead to 7-4.

Hooper also blasted a two-run homer over the left-field wall in the third inning. He finished with three hits and

On the day, North Carolina (14-0) notched seven of its eight runs with two outs, starting with a four-run burst in the third in which the Tar Heels took the lead for good.

"We scored some runs today with two out, which I thought was important," Fox said. "I thought Clay Hooper had some great at bats today."

Aside from the two-out rallies, the rest of the game was typical Tar Heel baseball. UNC came back to win a game in which it trailed for the eighth time in 14 contests. The offense scored six runs or more for the 13th time. Ryan Earey and Derrick DePriest again provided North Carolina with solid work

And just to stay even more consistent, Earey was twice hit by a pitch, raising his total to 12 on the year.
"It's early in the year, and these guys

are trying to get some innings under their belt," Earey explained. "They're pitching me inside, and I've never been one to be afraid to go ahead and take it off the arm. I'm just taking my normal cuts and getting popped a little bit. "I'm getting on base, so I can't real-ly complain about it."
