

Tar Heels Shut Out 'Pack, Deny Hopes for Revenge

The N.C. State women's tennis team sought redemption against North Carolina at Wednesday's match at Cone-Kenfield Tennis Center.

Instead, UNC evened its ACC record to 2-2 and sent the Wolfpack home a loser.

Last year, State's victory against UNC was overturned after Tar Heel coach Roland Thornqvist protested the match because the Wolfpack stacked its lineup. N.C. State rearranged the seeding of its singles players to create an unfair advantage.

This year's match left no room for protest.

Just four games into the first set, State's hopes took a hit. Francie Barrigan, the No. 1 player for the Wolfpack (4-9, 0-5 in the ACC), retired after 15 minutes of play. After chasing down a shot along the baseline by Tar Heel Marlene Mejia, Barrigan twisted her knee. Mejia was leading the match 3-1.

That was only the beginning of the end for the Wolfpack.

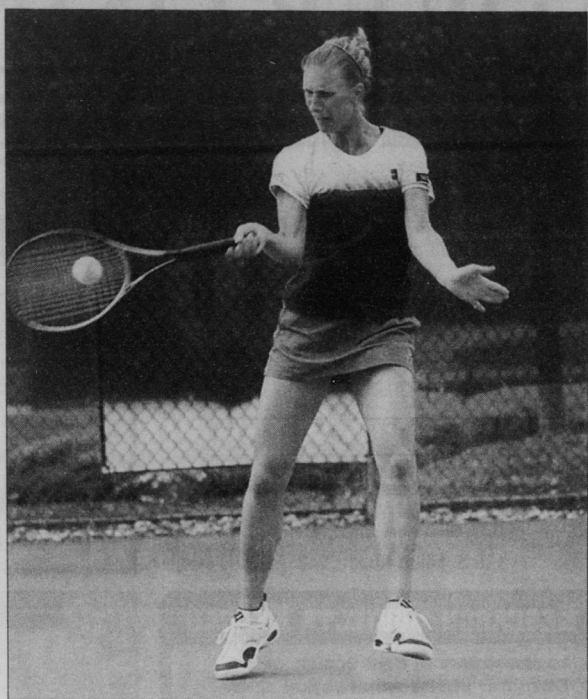
For the first time this season, UNC (7-8, 2-2) swept singles play. Three of the other five matches were decided in the first two sets.

"Anytime you win decisively, it's a good thing," Thornqvist said. "We did a great job of executing what we practiced all week, which makes me even more happy."

At practice, the Tar Heels focused on playing smart and consistent tennis at the end of matches.

No. 2 seed Jessica Zaganczyk began UNC's winning spree and demonstrated the practiced techniques by defeating State's Loni Worsley 6-1, 6-2.

"That was the most patient match

I've played," Zaganczyk said. "A lot of times I wanted to kill the ball on the second shot, but I won by being steady and patient."

Junior Courtney Zalinski came from behind and defeated No. 4 seed Kristin Nicholls, securing the match with a cross-court overhead slam. Her 3-6, 6-2, 7-5 win clinched the Tar Heel victory.

"I had no clue that my match decided the outcome," Zalinski said. "When

we won on every court, I was so psyched. It made my victory all the better."

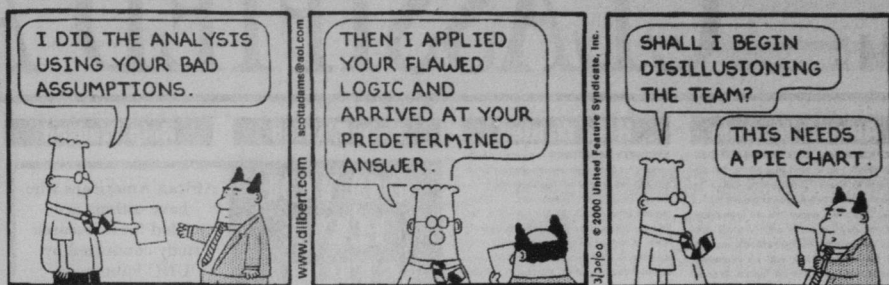
Because UNC was ahead 6-0 at the end of singles play, the coaches decided to forgo doubles.

Said Zaganczyk, "Sweeping (State) in singles really shows that we've bounced back from our first two ACC losses."
