"It's not me who's scamming the peo-ple," Ploutis said. "It's her."

Ploutis has also filed a lawsuit with the N.C. Attorney General's Office, suing Kapur for a list of offenses such as defamation of character, breach of contract and punitive damages. Despite the legal wrangling, Ploutis said EMS, Inc. would not leave the 75 students who bought the deal out in the cold.

at the memorial service for Hooker and came to tears again in front of the BOT in October when he spoke of how tuition would limit the University's accessibility to students like himself


Again on Tuesday, Heinke ended his speech and presidency teary-eyed – a dramatic end to a dramatic year.
