teammate's blast with one of his own on the very next pitch.

"I guess the big base hit, the home run by LaVigne seemed to be the thing that got us back over the hump," Womack said. "Carolina scores those three runs, they're ahead."

"If they put two or three zeroes on us, they gain a little momentum."

UNC had its eighth-inning comeback attempt cut short by LaVigne, the UVA closer. The right-handed fireballer moved to the mound from his usual position at short and snuffed out the rally.

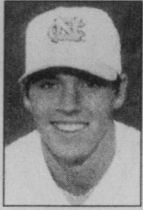
LaVigne did it all for Virginia in the series. He drove in four runs, scored three and went 4-for-10 in the series. His glove work at shortstop was nothing short of highlight-reel material. He went in the

hole toward third and made a spectacular catch and throw. He took part in at least five such gems in the series, sometimes gliding to his right, others to his left.

He also picked up a win in relief Friday.

"He had an outstanding weekend - offensively, defensively and on the mound," UNC coach Mike Fox said. "He'll probably be the ACC Player of the Week with the weekend he had."

The Tar Heels (36-11, 8-10) had a weekend they'd probably like to forget. They had a chance to get back to .500

in the ACC for the fourth time this season but again failed. "We keep climbing up to that .500 mark and can't seem quite to get there," Fox said.

UNC even had a rough time in its only win of the series, a 5-4 decision Saturday. Fox was thrown out of the game in the third inning for arguing a balk called on starter Chris Elmore. The runner eventually scored to give UVA a 4-2 edge.

But the event served to fire up Fox's squad and to settle Elmore down. Elmore allowed one hit during his next four innings of work before yielding to closer Derrick DePriest in the eighth.

"Whenever you see your head coach stick up for you, that's always going to pump you up," said Elmore, who allowed four earned runs in seven innings to improve to 6-1.

Fox might have received the boot in part because of his frustration with

Friday's game, a 6-5 loss. UNC starter Ryan Snare and UVA's Kevin Shourt traded zeroes until the Cavaliers finally scratched an unearned run across in the fourth, the same frame in which they

registered their first hit off Snare.

Virginia scored the deciding run in the bottom of the eighth inning when UNC's Jay Madeira, who entered the game for defensive purposes, fielded a

bunt and made an errant throw trying to cut down David Stone at the plate.

points Sunday after registering a goal and an assist the day before.

They weren't the only Tar Heels to struggle, however.

When they weren't scoring goals, which wasn't often, the Tar Heels were keeping UNC away from goalie Alex Kahoe. She finished with 15 saves, but UNC's shots rarely tested her.

"We did a good job of possession," Slingluff Levy said. "But we couldn't put the ball in the net, and we had a lot of turnovers because we couldn't finish inside of eight meters."

"It was very frustrating, but against this team, you've got to take every possession as gold."

The Tar Heels were without their third tri-captain, Gray MacNair, who suffered a hyper-extension of her right knee in the second half against the Blue Devils.

MacNair scored eight goals and netted two assists while starting all 13 of UNC's previous games.

"She's an influence out there, and we definitely missed her," Mohler said, while noting that MacNair's absence cannot be used as an excuse.

Added Mohler, "They simply played amazing."

Three Tar Heels Earn All-ACC Honors

Mohler and defender Porter Wilkinson were named to the All-ACC team Friday. UNC freshman Betsy Gaines was tabbed the Rookie of the Year.

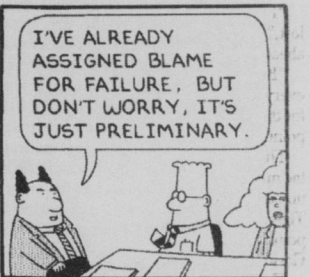

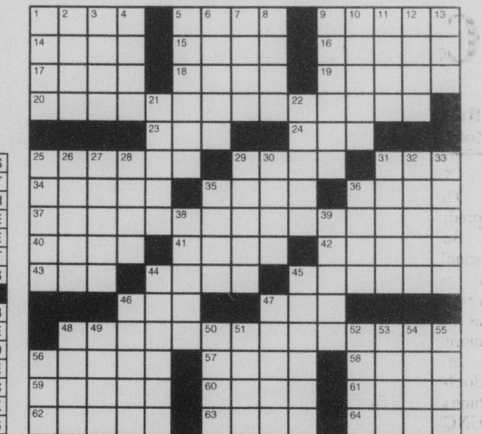
