

# Williams to Transfer; Parker Returns to Practice

**Junior Dominique Williams, who quarterbacked UNC to two victories last season, is leaving North Carolina.**

Dominique Williams is as responsible as anyone for Carl Torbush being back this season as North Carolina football coach. But he won't be around to see how the 2000 season turns out in Chapel Hill. Williams, who as an emergency quarterback led the Tar Heels to wins in their final two games of 1999, is transferring from UNC, Torbush announced Tuesday. "He and his family have made a decision that hopefully best suits Dominique for the rest of his life," Torbush said. "I hate to see him leave.

But I wish him nothing but the very best." Torbush declined to say which school Williams, a junior, was planning to attend next. Despite his strong finish last year, Williams was not expected to play a major role for the Tar Heels in 2000. He was slated to be no higher on the depth chart than the fifth-team tailback and the third-string fullback.

**Parker: Back in Action**

Redshirt freshman tailback Willie Parker, who is supposed to start Saturday, returned to practice for the first time since last week.

Parker, who strained his back running a sprint Thursday, took part in non-contact drills Tuesday. He said his back began bothering him toward the end of practice, but he expects to be ready to play against Tulsa. "I got better going to treatment, and

everybody has been helping me out a lot," Parker said. "By tomorrow, I should be better than what I was today." "I guess each day it's going to get better and better." If Parker is unable to go, true freshman Brandon Russell would probably get the starting nod.

**Kicking Game Still Uncertain**

One of the biggest questions facing the Tar Heels in the preseason has been the kicking game. The team's top three kickers from a year ago — Josh McGee, Brian Schmitz

and Derrick DePriest — exhausted their eligibility, leaving a group of inexperienced players competing for the vacant jobs.

Jeff Reed, a senior walk-on from Charlotte, has stepped forward to claim the place-kicking job.

The punting job, however, is more up in the air than ever.

Blake Ferguson, a true freshman from Broken Arrow, Okla., took the early lead for it but has since come back to the pack. John Lafferty, a sophomore from Valdese, would probably be the punter if the game was played today, Torbush said.

But Torbush added that he wouldn't make a decision until right before kickoff.

"Quite honestly, I don't think that either one of them need to know that they're going to punt right now," Torbush said. "We don't need them to sit there and worry about it for three days."

## Men's Soccer Looks to Get Over Hump

Last season, the North Carolina men's soccer team suffered through growing pains as an extremely young squad.

Seven freshman or sophomore starters equaled experience, which translated into close losses in important games.

A 1-0 home loss to then-No. 3 Duke. Another 1-0 defeat at the hands of then-No. 11 Maryland. And finally, UNC fell 2-1 in overtime to Furman in the first round of the NCAA tournament.

Despite the heartbreak of these near-miss losses, the Tar Heels knew the 2000 campaign could be brighter.

"They will soon find out.

UNC starts its season Friday against Illinois-Chicago in the UAB Nike Classic. The Tar Heels will play against host Alabama-Birmingham on Sunday.

"I think everyone on our team thinks that we can make a big dent in the tournament, make a good run at it," junior defender Chris Leitch said. "With the guys that we have now and the strong

recruiting class that came in, we have a very strong team."

UNC will need to capitalize on its offensive chances and make better decisions to improve on its 12-7-1 record and 2-3-1 mark in the ACC.

Coach Elmar Bolowich will also look to his nationally ranked recruits to fill the troublesome gaps from 1999.

Key among the six new Tar Heels are midfielder Logan Pause and defender David Stokes. Both have impressed Bolowich in preseason practices.

"Logan will be a great contributor," Bolowich said. "He seems to be tactically more mature than some of the players we've had here for longer periods." Stokes will supplement an already

strong defensive unit led by juniors Danny Jackson and Leitch. Jackson, who serves as a co-captain with midfielder Matt Laycock, was named second-team All-ACC last season and has started every game during the past two seasons.

Leitch started all 20 games for UNC last season. The speedy Ohio native has been slowed recently by a minor medial collateral ligament injury but should be ready for Friday's contest.

Despite the defense's relatively solid play during the past two years, Jackson said there is room for improvement.

"Our problem has been that we maybe give that off goal away," he said. Junior goalkeeper Michael Ueltschey, who posted six shutouts in 1999, returns between the pipes for UNC. Ueltschey ranked third among ACC netminders with a 1.04 goals-against average.

UNC's success will hinge upon its front line's ability to put the ball in the back of the net. Junior forward Chris Carrieri scored 12 goals and tallied five

assists en route to being named first-team All-ACC. Caleb Norkus had nine goals and two assists.

But even last year, when the Tar Heels scored 51 goals — their most since 1995 — many of those goals came against weaker competition.

Nine goals against Winthrop. Six tallies against High Point. A five-spot against UAB.

UNC came up short against the conference's best, though. Bolowich pointed to last year's game against Duke in October — when Blue Devil star forward Ali Curtis broke a scoreless tie at 83:24 after colliding with Ueltschey — as an example of the type of effort and determination the Tar Heels need to exert.

"Ali made a tremendous play and was able to shove that ball under the crossbar into the net sitting on his duff," Bolowich said. "We didn't have that on our side."

## Gamble Hopes to Make Olympic Trip Sure Bet

A slice of Sydney is coming to Chapel Hill.

Nicole Gamble, an assistant coach for the North Carolina track and field team, will lead a group of the United States' best female triple jumpers in the "Jump for Sydney" at Belk Track.

The competition begins at 6:30 p.m. today. Admission is free, and spectators will be allowed to come down on the track and watch the action up close. Door prizes will also be distributed.

The jumpers will be shooting for the Olympic 'A' qualifying standard (46 feet 1/4 inch) in the event. As Olympic Trials champion, Gamble will be heading to Sydney for the Games unless two of her competitors surpass the mark and she fails to do so.

Tiombe Hurd, who placed third in the Olympic Trials, and Natasha Alleyne-Gib, who placed fifth, are among those scheduled to compete.

Gamble wrapped up her UNC athletic career two years ago, finishing with one NCAA title and 13 All-America honors.
