

Field Hockey Captures 2 From Big Ten Opponents

ST. LOUIS — It took extra time, but North Carolina's field hockey squad topped Penn State 2-1 at the ACC/Big Ten Challenge in St. Louis on Monday.

Midfielder Jana Toepel scored the winning goal in the overtime period, bringing to the Tar Heels' record to 3-0 overall and 1-0 in the ACC.

Meredith Keller assisted Toepel on the goal, which came with 2:19 left in

overtime. UNC coach Karen Shelton said the play of goalkeeper Amy Tran was key to the Tar Heels' victory. Tran had 11 saves for the Tar Heels.

"We stole this win," Shelton said. "Penn State outplayed us. Without the outstanding play of Amy Tran, we would have lost this game."

Neither team scored in the first half. Penn State (2-2) got on the board first when Kiley Kulina scored on a penalty corner with 18:32 left in the game.

UNC tied the game with 10:56 to play when Tar Heel forward Abbey Woolley scored off an assist from

Toepel. The Tar Heels managed to draw only one penalty corner in the entire game, while Penn State had eight.

The Nittany Lions opened the challenge by handing Virginia its first loss of the season with a 3-1 victory.

UNC also defeated Michigan (2-1) in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge by a score of 4-2.

Four different Tar Heels chipped in with goals in the victory. Forwards Katie McDonald, Holly Huff and Woolley scored their first goals of the season. Toepel contributed her second of the year.

The Tar Heels outshot Michigan 16-10 and drew five penalty corners to the Wolverines' three.

McDonald and Huff helped the Tar Heels to a 2-1 halftime lead. Woolley grabbed an assist on Huff's goal.

UNC will take on its third consecutive Big Ten opponent, Iowa, in the Temple Invitational in Philadelphia on Saturday.

Loss Leaves UNC With Split

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. — The North Carolina men's soccer team split its two games at the UAB Nike Classic at West Campus Field.

The Tar Heels topped Illinois-Chicago 4-1 in Friday's contest but could not hold on to a second-half lead against tournament host Alabama-Birmingham on Sunday.

UAB freshman Jason McLaughlin scored with 16 seconds left in the game to give the Blazers a 2-1 win.

No. 21 UNC (1-1) struck first, taking a 1-0 lead at 58:59 on a goal by forward Chris Carrieri, who knocked in a header off a cross from Tar Heel Caleb Norkus.

The eighth-ranked Blazers got on the

board at 77:08 when forward Martin Rey headed in teammate Lane Knight's throw-in.

Knight assisted on McLaughlin's game-winning goal. McLaughlin beat Tar Heel goalkeeper Michael Ueltschey with a shot into the left corner of the net.

Carrieri scored one goal in each half of the Tar Heels' victory against Illinois-Chicago. Jay Batt and Eddie Robinson each chipped in a score of their own.

Batt, a freshman, scored the Tar Heels' first goal of the season 11 minutes into the game. Carrieri added a goal at 21:17 by putting back a rebound of a

The Tar Heels' kept UIC goalkeeper Chris Jamal busy. Jamal had six saves but allowed all four goals.

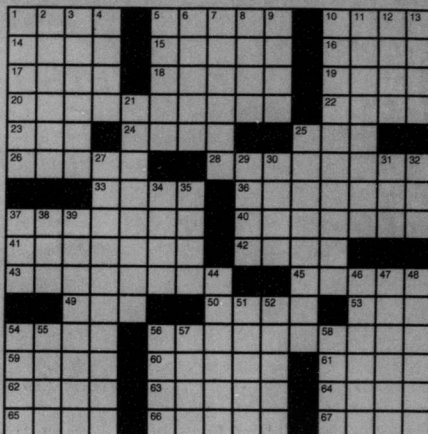
