FURMAN, S.C. – In what looked like a repeat of the ACC Championships, freshman Shalane Flanagan led North Carolina to a second-place finish in cross country at the NCAA Southeast region-

al on Saturday morning.

Duke's Terry Brennan crossed the line first overall in 30:37. UNC's Matt Weiss finished 32nd overall and first for the Tar Heels with a time of 31:54. Nick


