vidual medley and won the 200 freestyle with a time of 1:48.95.
"I am happy with my performance overall," Acuff said. "The 200 free was a (personal) best time."
Also adding double individual victories were Hathaway in the 100 and 200 breaststroke and Molly Sullivan in the 500 and 1,000 free. Sullivan swam to an easy win in the 1,000, finishing nearly eight seconds ahead of her teammate, senior Lauren Silva.
At the other end of the pool, the Tar Heel divers used their depth to contribute to the team score.
Although Maryland's Ashley Henyan won both the 1- and 3-meter diving events, UNC's Lindsay Waddell, Ashley Benner and Elizabeth Misti all earned points for North Carolina.
Finishing off the afternoon with a vic-

tory, Mack, Acuff, and Hathaway, along with freshman Jessi Perrequet, combined for a time of 3:25.73 in the 400-yard freestyle relay.
Tired as they were, North Carolina's easy win sends a message to the rest of the ACC, and to the country.
"The way we swam today is evident of how we will swim at ACC's," Mack said.
"We've been dominant in the conference, and we want to prove to everyone that the ACC has a lot to offer."

Men's Swimming Topples Terrapins

Senior Brad Kline summed up North Carolina's last home meet of the season in one short phrase.

"It was a good day," Kline said.
A good day was just what UNC men's swimming and diving team needed.

The Tar Heels handed Maryland its first conference loss 205-95 Saturday in Koury Natatorium. After losing to Virginia last week and with ACC Championships fast approaching, UNC wanted to regain momentum in the

conference.

"We had a tough loss last week against Virginia, which is our big rival," Kline said. "But Maryland is an ACC rival as well. We were pumped and swam really well."

Nine different Tar Heels claimed first place in their events. UNC (5-2, 3-1 in the ACC) won 12 of the 16 events.

"The win was definitely a confidence booster," said sophomore diver Stephen Krebs. "Maryland is a good team and we basically destroyed them."

The destruction began when sophomore Stephen Mohr finished just more than 13 seconds ahead of Maryland's first finisher in the 1000-yard freestyle.

UNC won the next six events.
Kline's good day peaked when he won the 200-yard relay with a season-best time of 1:40.

"We're starting to rest a little bit because ACCs are at the end of the month," Kline said. "Plus, the senior ceremony was pretty special, and having it be my last meet there definitely helped."

The Tar Heels dominated both relay events as well. Maryland (7-2, 1-1 in the ACC) never inched ahead of UNC's 'A' team in the 200 relay.

The 400 relay proved to be a bit more of a challenge for the Tar Heels. Maryland pulled out in front for the first two legs of the relay.
Unfortunately for the Terrapins, Tar

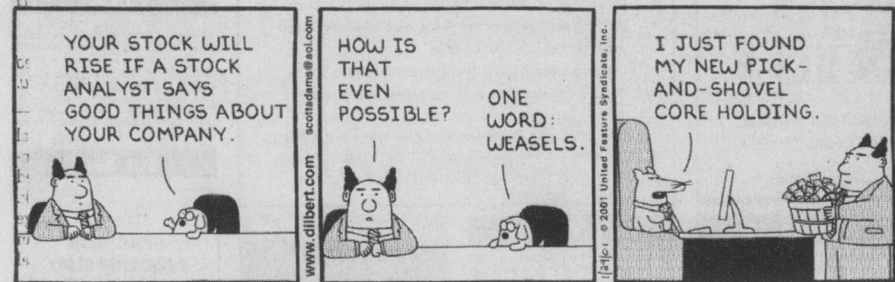
Heel freshman Justin Donato pulled ahead in the third leg. Junior standout Kevin Erndl anchored the 3:04 win for UNC, just more than one second ahead of Maryland.

In addition to anchoring both relay wins, Erndl also placed first in the 50 freestyle and second in the 100 freestyle.
The Tar Heels dominated the Terrapins at the other end of the pool as well. Krebs, the Tar Heels' only two-event winner, placed first in the 1- and 3-meter dives. He is undefeated in the ACC in both diving categories.

"I've been happy with my performances in conference meets," Krebs said. "I've really been working hard. But the real test will be if I qualify for Nationals."

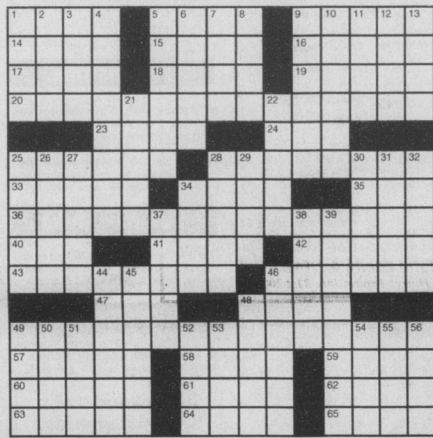

Sophomore point guard Coretta Brown led the Tar Heels with 17 points, while senior forward LaQuanda Barksdale chipped in 12 points and 12 rebounds.

The Tar Heels fell to 10-9 overall and 4-5 in the ACC.

University Park, Penn. — North Carolina track and field posted impres-



sive results this weekend at the Penn State Invitational. Although UNC coach Dennis Craddock only traveled with about 30 athletes, the men's and women's teams garnered a total of four NCAA provisional qualifiers.

Shalane Flanagan posted a provisional time of 4:56.66 in the mile run. In the high jump, Joy Ganes finished second with a provisional mark of 5-10 3/4. Lutisha Shittu clocked a NCAA provisional qualifying time of 8.42 in the 60-meter hurdles. Ian Douglas led the men with a provisional qualifying mark of 59-

9 in the shot put.

Gymnastics Falls to No.3 Georgia

ATHENS, Ga. — The North Carolina gymnastics team lost to third-ranked Georgia 196.500-191.425.

Maddy Curley scored 9.775 on beam and 9.775 on floor to place second in the all-around with a 38.70. Monica Middleton finished third in the all-around with a score of 38.575.

with any other creative endeavor, even painting houses," Mr. Steadman wrote in his letter, "and as the old pitcher Carl Hubell used to say, 'even rain.'"

His illness gradually began to take its toll on his body. Some days when I saw him at the office, he looked great. Other days, I could tell he was in pain. When I called Mrs. Dunham during winter break, she told me the news.

Mr. Steadman's cancer had spread to his brain, and the doctors did not expect him to live through the holidays.

On Dec. 31, 2000, the Ravens won the first playoff game in franchise history 21-3 against the Denver Broncos.

On Jan. 1, 2001, John Steadman was dead. He was 73.

I went to his funeral four days later. So did more than 400 people, crowded into a church in downtown Baltimore.

Among them were several old Baltimore Colts, Orioles owner Peter Angelos, broadcaster Jim McKay and

scores of reporters from the Sun, the Washington Post and the defunct News American. All came as friends.

Three weeks later, the media observed a moment of silence in the press box for Mr. Steadman in Tampa.

Sixty minutes later, the Ravens were Super Bowl champions.

A city celebrated late into the night. Somewhere, John Steadman celebrated with it.

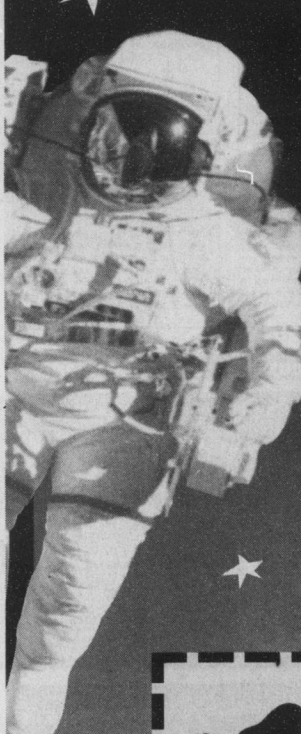
