

Tar Heels Take Down Spartans

North Carolina freshman Jake Reynolds needed double overtime to defeat UNC-G's Nate Parmenter 8-5.

One must think of possible consequences in scheduling, North Carolina wrestling coach Bill Lam can say he learned his lesson Saturday — or maybe not.

The Tar Heels blanked UNC-Greensboro 41-0 at Carmichael Auditorium, then headed west to defeat Appalachian State in Boone later that night.

The victories put North Carolina back at .500 with a 4-4 dual meet record (1-0 in the ACC).

At the start of the year, two matches in 24 hours looked very plausible to a talent-laden team. But recent injuries and defections caused concern about the doubleheader for Lam and the Tar Heels.

"I did it (the schedule) on purpose early in the year," Lam said after his team's win against the Spartans.

"But we've had some situations where Matt (Kenny) has just come back, Brad (Byers) is still not at full strength and Chuckie (Connor) quit, so that makes it a real challenge with Appalachian State (Saturday)."

"But we need that kind of competi-

tion to get better." Lam said he was confident about his team's chances against UNC-G but not enough to foresee a shutout effort.

"We should be able to beat Greensboro, but I thought we did even better to shut them out," Lam said.

It didn't come without some close calls.

In the 141-pound bout, freshman Mike Booth faced a 1-0 deficit late in the third period before scoring a reversal and near fall.

Booth sneaked behind and on top of Spartan Corey Williams to get the eventual winning points and put UNC up 11-0 after three bouts.

Despite being down to a senior wrestler, Booth said he never thought he was going to lose.


"I was still pretty confident going into the final period," Booth said. "I've been in that position before, and I knew what I needed to do. At the end, it was actually a bonus to get the near fall, so I just went for it."

Lam said, "That's probably one of the better guys on their team and, coming in as a freshman, (Booth has) been getting a little better but hasn't put together his wins yet, so I was proud of him."

Lam gave another freshman, Jake Reynolds, a chance to win in the match's 165-pound bout.

Reynolds responded strongly in the opening periods, posting a 6-2 lead heading into the final seconds of the third until a slip-up occurred.

Spartan Nate Parmenter noticed Reynolds pulling away late and took charge. He scored a takedown and two back points to tie the score at 6-6 with

two seconds remaining in regulation.

"I relaxed too much," Reynolds said. "I shouldn't have relaxed and just waited until it was all over, but he caught me."

"But I had to keep my head cool and not get upset about it, because if I did, then my wrestling would've been a lot poorer than it was at the very end."

A cooler head did help Reynolds prevail as he notched a reversal in the second sudden-death overtime session to gain a 8-6 win and push UNC's lead to 24-0.

Nick Richmond tallied UNC's only pin of the afternoon, placing UNC-G's Josh Books' shoulders to the mat in 3:29 in the 184-pound division.

Redshirt freshman Chris Collins, starting for Chuckie Connor, set the

tone in the opening bout of the 125-pound match, beating Spartan Tony Stewart via technical fall, 16-0, to give UNC a 5-0 start to the match.

North Carolina's wrestling program announced Thursday that Connor, a senior, left the program for personal reasons.

JohnMark Bentley added to his win streak, as UNC-G's Anthony Warren (medical forfeit) and Appalachian State's Davey Blake lost to the 149-pound junior, giving Bentley 12 straight wins on the season.

Corey Bell earned a 7-3 decision against Spartan Terry Garbis in the 174-pound match while in the heavyweight division, UNC's Ryan Adams grabbed a major decision from 12-2 from John Kimble.

and drew a foul from Kenny Inge. Haywood, a 49-percent free throw shooter on the season, knocked down both of his freebies.

The development was a surprise to just about everyone in the ESA — except Haywood's teammates.

"Brendan has put so much work in on his free throws," Curry said. "We knew he would come through in that situation."

The free throws were huge, but Haywood was just getting started. He swatted away a 3-point attempt by Scooter Sherrill on N.C. State's ensuing possession, giving the Tar Heels the ball back.

Haywood raced out from the low block on the left side of the floor to meet Sherrill just as he was releasing the ball.

"He didn't see me coming from the baseline," Haywood said. "I knew we were up three, and I couldn't let him get it off."

After Curry missed the front end of a one-and-one, the Wolfpack had another chance to tie the game. Haywood cut off a drive by guard Anthony Grundy, deflecting the ball out of bounds with 34.7 seconds left.

N.C. State called timeout to set up a

play, which resulted in Grundy throwing a lob to Damon Thornton for an attempted alley-oop. The duo was successful with the play early in the second half, but this time there was an obstacle.

Haywood broke up the lob, and Joseph Forte knocked down two free throws to seal the game after he corralled the loose ball.

"It was one of the options, and it was open, so he threw it," Thornton said. "I felt like it was mistimed a little bit, but I thought (Haywood) got his hand on it." Haywood had done his share to help the Tar Heels hold on, but he rebounded a missed 3-pointer by Clifford Crawford on N.C. State's next possession for good measure.

That rebound gave him six — to go with 10 points and five blocks — for the game. Haywood's final numbers weren't eye-popping, but his play in the closing seconds was.

And no play was bigger for the Tar Heels than the two free throws he made to give them a three-point cushion.

"I'm happy for him," UNC forward Jason Capel said. "He works on his free throws a lot. It was a critical part of the game, and for him to step up and knock those down was huge for our team."

Ravens Stifle Giants, Win 1st NFL Crown

Ray Lewis and Baltimore's defense lived up to the hype, capturing four interceptions and the 34-7 Super Bowl win.

TAMPA, Fla. — Baltimore's brazen defense backed up its bragging.

After boasting all week that the Giants couldn't move on their league-leading unit, Ray Lewis and the Ravens did what they said they would, beating New York 34-7 for their first Super Bowl win.

Despite the score, Sunday's game was as advertised — a battle of defenses until New York's wilted late in the game. The Ravens intercepted Kerry Collins four times, the final pick returned 49 yards for a touchdown by Duane Starks, the first of three TDs on three plays late in the third quarter.

The other two were kickoff returns for scores by Ron Dixon of New York and Jermaine Lewis of Baltimore, the first time that's ever happened in a Super Bowl.

Otherwise, Ray Lewis, the Super Bowl MVP, and the rest of the Baltimore defense smothered the Giants, who scored 41 points and punted only once against Minnesota in the NFC title game.

The victory gave 75-year-old Art Modell his first Super Bowl win in 40 years as an owner. He won one NFL title in 35 seasons in Cleveland before moving his franchise to Baltimore in

1996, but he had never been to a Super Bowl, losing two close AFC title games in Cleveland. Modell won by beating his good friend Wellington Mara of the Giants, who has 75 seasons in the NFL.

So effective was Baltimore's defense that the New York offense never got inside its 29. The game might as well have been stopped after Trent Dilfer's 38-yard touchdown pass to Brandon Stokley with 6:50 left in the first quarter gave the Ravens a 7-0 lead. It stayed that way for most of the first half.

Brad Maynard of the Giants and Kyle Richardson each ended up breaking the record of nine punts. There were 21 punts (Maynard had 11, Richardson 10). It was still 10-0 late in the third quarter when the game exploded. Starks started it by stepping in front of Amani Toomer on a first down, grabbing the ball and racing 49 yards untouched to the end zone to give Baltimore a 17-point lead.

Game over? Not quite.

Dixon, who returned the opening kickoff for a touchdown in New York's playoff win against Philadelphia, returned the kickoff 97 yards for a score. But then Jermaine Lewis grabbed Brad Daluiso's kickoff, weaved through the Giants and ran up the sideline for an 84-yard TD and 17-point lead, 24-7.
