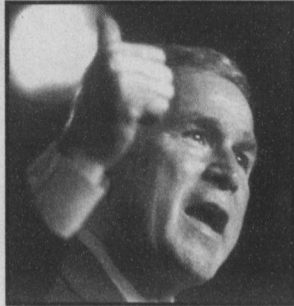

- George W. Bush chooses John Ashcroft to be his Attorney General. Ashcroft opposes a woman's right to choose, even in cases of rape and incest.

- Anti-choice Congress members launch a renewed assault on reproductive rights, confident that George W. Bush's signature will make their measures law.

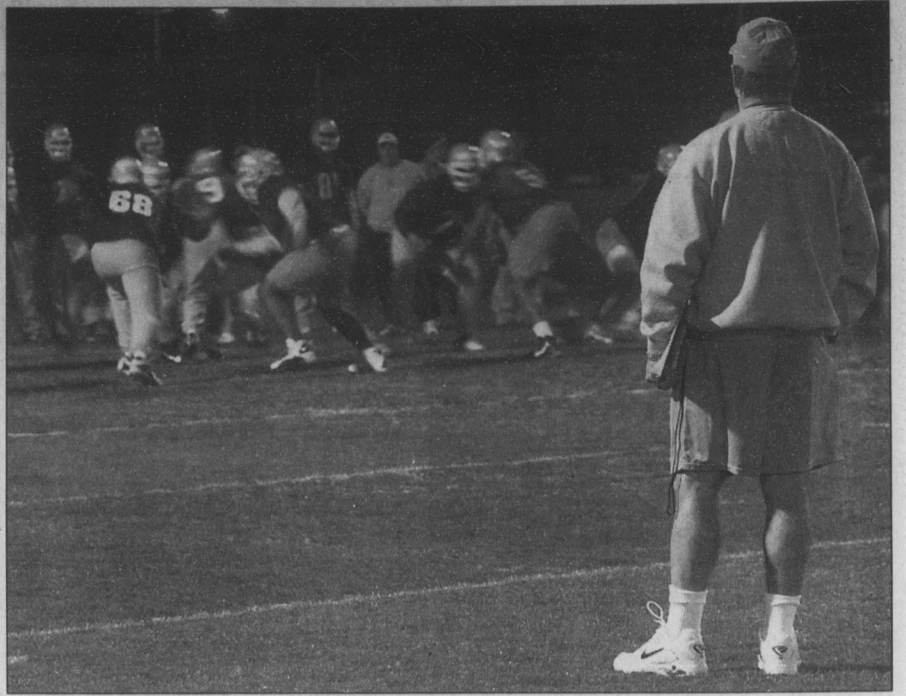

Spring Football Practice Opens

The John Bunting era is officially under way, as North Carolina's new football coach took the team's reins for the first time Tuesday.

The early evening practice was the first of the year for the Tar Heels, who finish spring practice April 21 with the annual spring game at Kenan Stadium.

Bunting, a 1971 North Carolina graduate, left his job as the New Orleans

Saints' linebacker coach in 2000.

The UNC head coaching job is the second of Bunting's career. He led Division III Rowan from 1988-92.

Other new faces in the coaching staff include offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Gary Tranquill, who spent the previous two seasons in the same capacity with Virginia, and defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach Jon Tenuta, formerly with Ohio State.

Rod Broadway (defensive tackles), Jeff

Connors (strength and conditioning), Dave Huxtable (linebackers and special teams) and André Powell (running backs) are in their first year as UNC coaches.

The Tar Heels open their season Aug. 25 at defending national champion Oklahoma and start the season with three consecutive road games for the first time since 1893.

UNC's first regular season game at home is Sept. 15 against Southern Methodist.

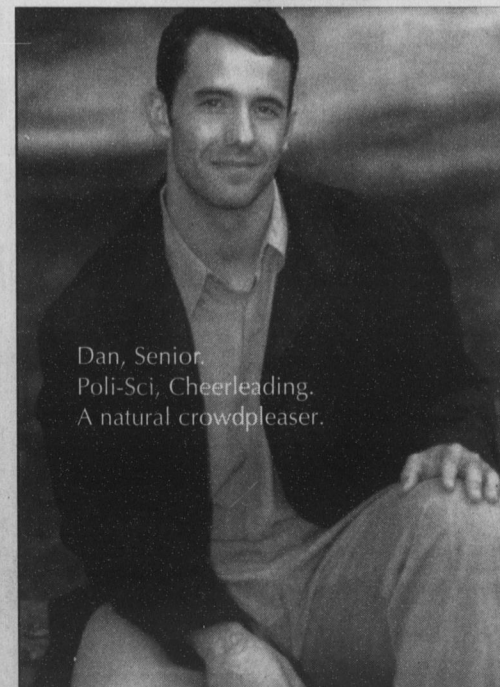
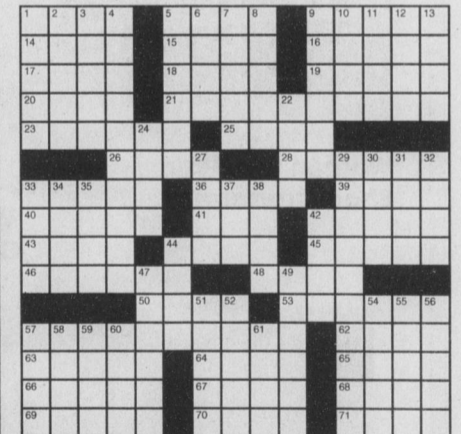

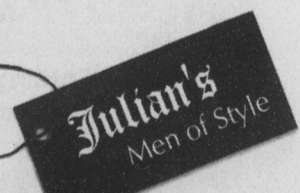
