tower of the dental school," Sandler said. "It helps them to be more well rounded in their thinking about what could happen in the future." Students sometimes reconsider their career goals or re-evaluate career possibilities after working in the public health field, he said. "It helps them plan their future." Sandler said. "Most come in thinking they'll go into private practice." Not only does the program provide real-life experience for students, Sandler said the partnership has made an impact on the dental health of county children. Screening results state that cavities in

Orange County children, enrolled in first through eighth grades, have been reduced by more than 50 percent during the past 20 years. Dental students donate their services to school-aged students three days a week, while they generally only dedicate two days a week to adult care. Orange County is one of only about 20 to 25 other counties that have similar dental care units in county health department units, Sandler said. He said the entire dental community of Orange County deserves credit for the program's successes in improving residents' dental health. "The evidence is in the mouths of the children."

Jacobs also said the resolution included a commitment to alleviate the pains of the explosive growth that the Chapel Hill-Carrboro school system has faced in recent years. The referendum will appear on the ballot Nov. 6. The package would allocate \$75 million to various projects, including \$47 million to the construction of three new schools - two elementary schools in the Chapel Hill-Carrboro school system and middle school in Orange County. The referendum will also include \$20 million for parks, recreation and open space. Senior centers and affordable

housing projects weighed in, each receiving a \$4 million chunk of the \$75 million bond. Gordon said she introduced the second resolution Tuesday night to get a firm commitment from the commissioners to build a new high school. "This resolution would not displace the resolution already intact," Gordon said. But Jacobs said the old resolution was sufficient for funding the planning stages of the new high school. "I think the public should be assured that the Orange County Board of Commissioners' commitment to education remains unmatched and constant." The City Editor can be reached at citydesk@unc.edu.

will allow doctors to e-mail the results to colleagues for second opinions. Pisano said the researchers also will examine the cost-effectiveness of the digital technology because film machines only cost about \$100,000, compared to the \$300,000 to \$500,000 price tag for a new digital machine. Pisano said researchers need to be cautious before eliminating film mammography, which is one of the most important tools doctors have to fight cancer. "We don't want to take a step back." ed by the state bond referendum passed last November - are at the top of his list. One thing Vandermeer would like to see is a building that can pick up where the present music library leaves off, such as delivering digitized sound in efficient ways. "We're going to need a facility that's going to facilitate that new way of doing things," he said. During his 13 years as head music librarian at the University of Maryland, Vandermeer helped create a new performing arts library for the institution. And Diane Steinhaus, public services librarian who acted as head librarian for about a year, said this made Vandermeer a prime candidate for the post. "I know because of the bond package there was a lot of concern of someone having experience building a new music library," she said. 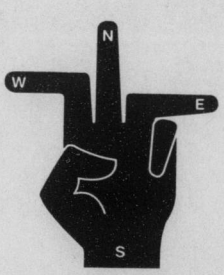

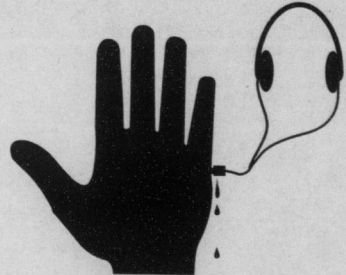

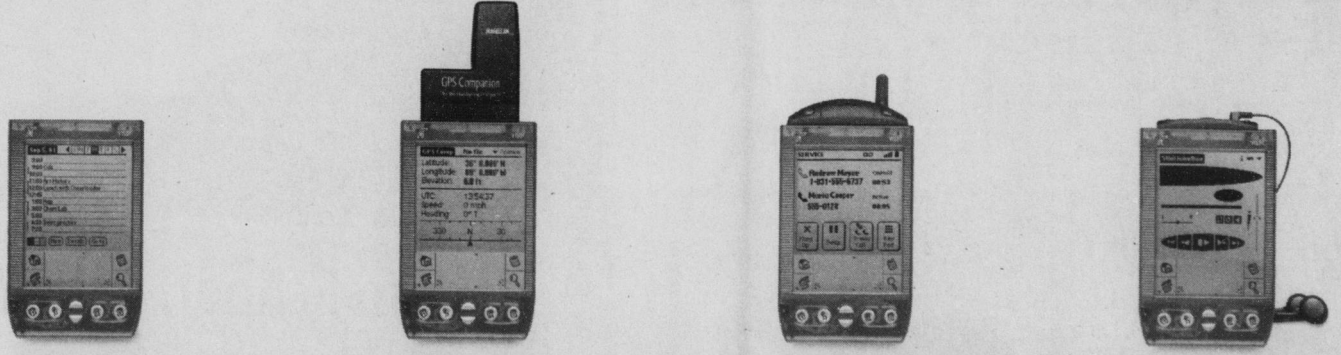
