

# Pinchbeck Paces Men's Tennis

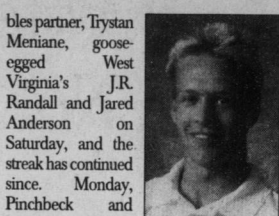
North Carolina freshman Daniel Pinchbeck extended his consecutive-games streak to 52 in a UNC win Monday.

You could say that Daniel Pinchbeck had another easy day. After barely breaking a sweat against Furman and West Virginia, the Australian freshman had won 32 consecutive games.

The streak progressed to 52 on Monday as the North Carolina men's tennis team smothered Campbell 7-0 at the Cone-Kenfield Tennis Center. "I'm really just playing some tennis," said the sixth-seeded Pinchbeck, who won both his singles and doubles matches. "I've just been focusing on every point and winning games while doing my bit."

bles partner, Trystan Meniane, goose-egged West Virginia's J.R. Randall and Jared Anderson on Saturday, and the streak has continued since. Monday, Pinchbeck and Meniane beat Jiri Beranok and Loic Legoff 8-0.

"The streak is definitely pretty crazy," Meniane said. "It's especially crazy with the doubles match. I don't exactly get to see the singles matches, but I'm guessing he is playing very well."

UNC coach Sam Paul switched the lineup Monday, moving No. 5 Meniane to the No. 3 spot and moving the previously third-seeded Geoff Boyd and No. 4 Andy Metzler back a position.

Boyd finished off Zorick Tolstan 6-3, 6-0, while Metzler beat Martin Parkes 6-3, 6-1. Pinchbeck then swept Steve Hoeltschi 6-0, 6-0.

The top two seeds didn't have any trouble winning their points, as No. 1 Marcio Petrone beat Andreas Mardbrink 6-1, 6-4. Petrone tallied nine winners to Mardbrink's four.

UNC's No. 2 seed, Nicholas Monroe, won 6-1, 6-4 against Sasa Ljubic.

The Tar Heels (4-1) won the doubles point in less than an hour, with the No. 1 doubles team of Monroe and Boyd winning 8-2 against Mardbrink and Ljubic of Campbell (1-2).

The finish improved upon the pair's loss last week to West Virginia.

"Our doubles played better than they did last week," Paul said. "They need to come out there and play every match."

The No. 2 doubles team also won Monday, as Petrone and Greg Archer topped Tolstan and Parkes 8-4.

"I feel like we are in a good spot," Paul said. "I'm pleased with where we are, and if we continue to get better each day we should be able to win a few big matches."

Keys for UNC: Whoa — slow down. If North Carolina wants a shot at stealing its second road win, it'll have to keep the pace down. The lower the score, the better the Tar Heels' chances, or at least the fewer they'll get beaten by, which is apparently the new standard. To do this, UNC will have to play tough defense and be selective, itself, on the offensive end.  
Keys for Virginia: Virginia, which scores 81.3 points per game, needs to build momentum after breaking its four-game losing streak with a win against Clemson 85-71 on Sunday. The Cavaliers have to take advantage of another ACC bottom-feeder to get back into the conference race. A pivotal game at Wake Forest looms this weekend.  
UNC Bench: Matt Doherty continues to rotate nine players in and out, still searching for that elusive lineup that clicks. However, Jackie Manuel's foot injury somewhat limits the bench.  
Virginia Bench: The Cavaliers sorely miss Adam Hall's 9.0 points and 4.8 rebounds per game. Since he partially tore foot tissue, Virginia has essentially been reduced to an eight-man team. But the Cavs are athletic enough to manage with a short reserve.

# 4 Tar Heels Selected in WUSA Draft

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. — Two members of the North Carolina women's soccer team were chosen Monday in the 2002 Women's United Soccer Association draft. Midfielder Jena Kluegel was taken with the third pick by Boston, and defender Danielle Borgman was taken with the eighth pick by San Jose.

A flanker with UNC, Kluegel is expected to be a defender for the Breakers. She recorded eight goals and eight assists for 26 points in 2001 and was named a finalist for the Hermann Award.

Borgman was a member of the last two under-21 Nordic Cup championship squads. Borgman notched seven assists for the Tar Heels last season.

In addition, two Tar Heel goalkeepers were taken in the draft.

Senior Kristin DePlatchett went to Atlanta, while Shelley Finger, who graduated in 1994, was drafted by San Diego.

**Teasley Snags Weekly Honor**

For the second time this season and the seventh time in her career, North Carolina's Nikki Teasley has been named the ACC Women's Basketball Player of the Week. Teasley averaged 17.3 points, 5.3 rebounds and 5.0 assists last week in UNC's wins against Florida State,

Villanova and N.C. State.

Teasley led the Tar Heels (19-6, 8-4 in the ACC) with 22 points as they defeated Florida State 93-63 on Monday. She totaled a season-high nine assists and committed just one turnover in the win.

In a 49-45 nonconference win against Villanova on Wednesday, she had seven points and tied her season high with eight rebounds. Sunday, in an 80-71 win at N.C. State, Teasley scored 23 points to lead UNC to its first win in Raleigh since 1994. Teasley was 6 of 11 from the field (5 of 10 from 3-point range) and

scored 15 of her points in the second half.

For the week, she shot 48.5 percent from the field, 52.4 percent from 3-point range.

Teasley is averaging 15.6 points, 4.7 assists and 4.0 rebounds per game for the season. She leads the Tar Heels in 3-point percentage (a career-best 41.4 for the season) and free-throw percentage (84.9).

The team's only senior, Teasley is UNC's career leader in assists and ranks second all-time in 3-pointers.
