"It's a sour taste," said senior cornerback Kevin Knight. "My senior year, I don't win a game at home — that's frustrating for me. So it's hard to deal with, but I've got to deal with it."

The Tar Heels still have two games remaining on their schedule but both are on the road — at Florida State on Saturday and at Duke on Nov. 23. UNC hasn't won since defeating Arizona State in Tempe, Ariz. on Oct. 5.

UNC coach John Bunting made no attempt to sugarcoat the loss or the feeling of going 0-6 at home.

"It's about as tough as gets," he said.

Bunting said he "had made a very big point about the seniors" leading up to the game against the Tigers, but the pre-game attempt at motivation obviously was not enough — the disappointment of which was not lost on UNC's younger players.

"I still have two more years, but I just feel so bad for the seniors that we couldn't help to get them a win at home," sophomore wideout Jawarski Pollock said. "So next year, I'm just going to think about that. That's going to be my motivation: I couldn't get a senior to win a game at home."

The UNC seniors — even though they'll never have another chance to taste glory in front of the home crowd — said they hope that their younger counterparts don't forget the difficult lessons learned this season.

"I don't think anybody on the team now wants to go through what they're going through this year next year," said senior wideout Chesley Borders. "I think that this year is a tremendous learning experience for them, and I think that's going to push them even harder next year."

I was coming," said Ericson, whose visit to the school had just ended the day before.

Although his adjustment to UNC was slow, it certainly did not affect his results in the pool. The degree of his early success is seldom seen in college swimming.

"I was sure he was talented," Comfort said. "But I'm not sure he even knew he would be an All-American so soon."

Teammate Eric Wheeler, who graduated a year before Ericson in 1983, noticed Ericson's talent immediately.

"He had a lot of God-given ability," Wheeler said.

While Ericson treasures his individual accomplishments, one of his greatest moments was the team's ACC championship in 1983, the team's first in 19 years.

Ericson went on to become a captain in his senior season, putting his natural motivational skills to use with his teammates.

"He wasn't an outspoken leader," Wheeler said of Ericson. "He was one who led by example."

With all his success, Ericson has just one regret — failing to compete in the Olympics. He missed qualifying for the 1984 games by .3 seconds.

"(It was) one of the more disappointing things (in my career)," Ericson said.

Despite his failure to make the Olympic team, Ericson just could not walk away from the sport. After returning to Delaware for a year, Comfort asked Ericson if he would be interested in running a new aquatic club and becoming an assistant coach for the Tar Heels.

"It didn't take much to convince me to come back," Ericson said.

The North Carolina Aquatic Club, based in Chapel Hill, has produced many swimmers for UNC.

Comfort remembered that Ericson's organization and his ability to motivate his swimmers contributed to his coaching abilities.

"You just wanted to swim fast for him," Comfort said.

During his coaching stint, he met his wife, Jeanne Crabbe Ericson, who was diving at the time for the Tar Heels.

A wedding and three kids later, Ericson, now 40, runs his own company involved in financial services. It is affiliated with Northwestern Mutual.

"(One) goal in life was to have my own business," he said. "It's been a tough year, but I enjoy the business very much."

Ericson continues to swim competitively in the United States Master's meets. He set a world record in the 100 backstroke for the 35-39 age group in 2000, and now he has graduated to the 40-44 group.

Ericson's children also have begun to swim. Although Ericson is conscious of not forcing them into swimming competitively, he concedes that he would love to see them continue to develop their talents.

Said Ericson, "It would make me very happy to see my kids swim for Carolina."

UNC Inches Closer to Top ACC Tourney Seed

WINSTON-SALEM — The 12th-ranked North Carolina volleyball team defeated Wake Forest 3-1 Saturday.

The 30-28, 30-21, 27-30, 30-25 win improves the Tar Heels' record to 25-2 overall and 12-1 in the ACC, while Wake falls to 13-15 (6-8).

Sophomore outside hitter Molly Pyles led the way for the Tar Heels with 23 kills and 11 digs.

Senior outside hitter Laura Greene recorded a double-double for the fifth straight match with 15 kills and 16 digs.

On Friday, UNC defeated Duke 3-0 at Cameron Indoor Stadium. Laura Greene led the Tar Heels with 21 digs and 16 kills, including hitting seven of eight attempts in the first game with no errors for a North Carolina single-game record .875 hitting percentage.

Rowing Places 3rd

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. — The North Carolina novice women's rowing squad finished out its fall competition on Sunday with a successful race at the Rivanna Romp.

In the novice eight race, UNC's A boat finished third overall (15:34.4) and the Tar Heels' B boat came in sixth

(6:18.2) in a 13-boat field.

Pinchbeck Falls in Quarterfinals

DALLAS — Senior Kate Pinchbeck avenged her loss at the ITA Regional Finals to Clemson's Julie Coin by defeating Coin 6-4, 2-6, 6-1 in the second round of the ITA Indoor National Championships.

Pinchbeck advanced to the quarterfinals, where she was defeated by Alexis Gordon of Florida 6-2, 6-2.

Sophomore Kendall Cline defeated Vida Mulec of Baylor 5-7, 6-2, 6-1 in her first consolation match on Friday.

Stanford's Lauren Barnikow then defeated Cline 6-2, 6-0 in the second round.
