By Rob Leichner Staff Witer Student voters passed a referendum Tuesday increasing student activity fees by $\$ 10$ for graduate students to benefit

Even up to the final minute，campaign signs were still visible in Carrol Hall on Tuesday as student body president candidates，surrounded by their
campaign staffs，waited for the general election ansults Finally at $11: 15$ p．m．，Brian Fauver，chairman of the Board of Elections， announced that Matt Tepper and Sang Shin will enter a runoff election next week．Tepper garnered 35.35 percent of the more than 6,000 votes cast， while 24.54 percent voted for Shin．
