## Sushi bar adds variety to Lenoir

To entice students, Miso has been offering free samples, and Lawrence said it will continue to to do so for students who are squeamish about trying sushi.

Mainstreet Lenoir also is sched-

uled to introduce Alpine Bagles later this year, and a Mongolian food stand is planned to be opened next to Miso.


