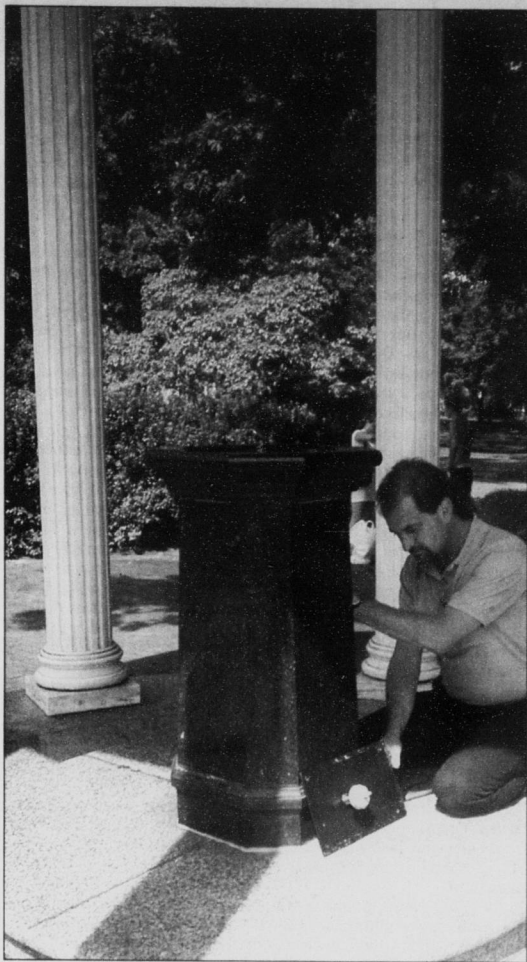

Sushi bar adds variety to Lenoir

Carolina Dining Services is giving students a raw deal.

Mainstreet Lenoir, located on the first floor of Lenoir Dining Hall, now has a sushi bar in addition to its fast food chain restaurants such as Subway and Burger King.

The sushi bar is one of several attempts by CDS to offer students a wider variety of dining options.

The "Miso: Rice and Noodle" sushi bar, opened earlier this month, has already become popular among many students.

As they sampled the cuisine for the first time, some students said they are excited about the new option for dining.

"I think the sushi bar is great," said Adam Schaefer, a second-year law student. "It offers much needed ethnic diversity."

To provide information about the types of sushi offered, Lynn Lawrence, the local demonstrator with Miso's wholesaler, AFC Corp., was at Lenoir on Monday wearing a traditional Japanese kimono.

She said she was glad to see that the sushi bar was received so well by students.

"We want to overcome the stigma that sushi means raw fish," she

said.

She explained that sushi actually means pickled rice, and 70 percent of the menu is fully cooked seafood and fresh vegetables. The menu also offers vegetarian sushi and traditional raw fish sushi.

To entice students, Miso has been offering free samples, and Lawrence said it will continue to do so for students who are squeamish about trying sushi.

Mainstreet Lenoir also is scheduled to introduce Alpine Bagles later this year, and a Mongolian food stand is planned to be opened next to Miso.

Students also will notice changes to Top of Lenoir, UNC's main dining facility, located on the second floor of Lenoir Hall.

"This year we're really looking to refresh the food in Lenoir," said Ira Simon, CDS director. "We're coming up with new ideas to really make it exciting."

Simon said that although Lenoir offers many different dining options, CDS is trying to offer students a constantly changing menu to provide more variety.

"Because a lot of choices were the same everyday, many students complained that there was no variety," he said.

Simon added that the Grille

area, which usually serves food such as hamburgers and french fries, will begin to expand its variety to remain fresh to students.

At night the Grille will offer different types of food ranging from Philly cheese steak to bacon cheeseburgers.

Simon said students also will be

provided with more options to personalize their food to their unique tastes.

"In the Top of Lenoir Grille they're really coming up with some creative ideas."
