

GAA parade promotes spirit

About 20 groups plan to participate

More than 20 organizations are slated to participate in what is expected be a fun and spirited event sponsored by the General Alumni Association.

For the past two years the parade was organized by the Carolina Athletic Association.

Organizers said the parade will kick off at the Bell Tower and travel to the Old Well via Raleigh Street and Cameron Avenue. In the event of rain the parade will continue, unless weather becomes severe.

The parade's purpose is to represent visually the theme of Homecoming, which is "Crazy for Carolina," said Sallie Hutton, one of the organizers and GAA coordinator of alumni reunions. "We would like a large involvement from both student organizations and the town and hope for the parade to be fun and spirited."

Many community groups are planning to join students in the celebration. Stormy, mascot for the Carolina Hurricanes, will make an appearance. Local antique cars also will be on display, said Katie Jensen, GAA Homecoming parade chair.
