But he is content with the current situation. "We understand that the athletic department faces difficult decisions, and we trust their judgment," Knudsen said. "It is not our place to seek out varsity recognition."

Despite respecting these decisions, Knudsen thinks teams at UNC are hurt by Title IX regulations. "While it's great to see the women's team get recognition, it's unfortunate that other teams on campus are left behind," he said.

For the most part, Giertz said, Title IX makes things equal among sports teams.

"I don't blame Title IX," Giertz said. "I think it's a great opportunity for women's teams."

Condrin said the move of the women's team move to varsity status signifies progress for the sport — for both men and women.

Condrin said he is excited about the future of UNC's crew program. "The programs here at Carolina really are moving in the same direction," he said. "At the end of the day, we're all out there trying to

develop faster rowers."

Knudsen said that despite the difficulties of being a club sport, the results are well worth the effort.

"Because we have to put so much into the club, I can look at anyone on my team and know that he isn't there for the free Nike shoes," Knudsen said.

"Everyone there is passionate about the sport."

"(The basis for attack) isn't even political at all," Chilton said. "Perhaps (it's) a personal or even racial issue."

Incumbent Alex Zaffron said he cannot understand why anyone would want to attack Brown. "She is the most statesman-like of all the candidates." He also expressed disappointment in the fact that Carrboro's long history of respectful, progressive politics has been disrupted by the attacks.

"This is the sort of juvenile trick one would expect in a junior high

school election," Zaffron said.

Candidate Steven Rose echoed Zaffron's sentiment in a posting on <http://www.orangepolitics.org>, saying, "This sign vandalism is the worst I have seen in 28 years of politics in this area. ... It is a direct attack on freedom of speech."

However, Nelson said he does not think the attacks will have an

impact on voters' actions in today's elections.

"Carrboro voters are very intelligent people who dislike negative campaigns," he said. "I don't think the voters of Carrboro will put up with this childish behavior."

"But luckily other people have done it already, and we can look to them for guidance."

Tepper pointed to Western Illinois University, which pioneered guaranteed tuition in 1999. Monica Eskridge, a WIU admissions counselor, said she would recommend the strategy to UNC-CH.

"I think it's been great," she said. "It's helped some people make their decision of where to go, and it's helped them stay focused. They're more apt to stick to their program because they know that tuition will go up the fifth year."

Dean Bresciani, UNC-CH's interim vice chancellor for student affairs, said he does not think UNC-CH tuition is in need of change. "Our impression is that we

are doing pretty well nationally," he said. "In some ways, I expect we would be looked at."

Tepper was quick to explain the need for his search. "This is important not just for the yearly fight but also for the long-term tuition increases here at Carolina and other universities across the state."

joint investigation between Chapel Hill police and the FBI.

Karen McCall, vice president of public affairs and marketing for UNC Health Care said Savage has not been fired from his position.

"He's on administrative leave with pay during the first part of the

investigation," she said.

McCall said Savage's leave began the day of his arrest and will continue until after the investigation.

When the initial investigation began in July, UNC was not aware Savage's home computer had been taken by authorities, she said.

Savage was arraigned Friday at Orange County District Court in Hillsborough.

He was read his rights and signed a waiver dismissing a state-appointed attorney.

There will be a screening for the charges against Savage on Dec. 11 at the Hillsborough district court. Charges brought against Savage still are pending in Orange County.

donate. For example, they can't have traveled outside the United States or received a tattoo in the previous year.

The donation process takes about 2 1/2 hours.

Platelets have a five-day shelf life outside the body before they

are not suitable for transfusions, Peterson said. The first two days are needed for testing the platelets, leaving three days for the platelets to be available for patients.

Peterson said platelet donations are particularly vital for people receiving treatment for cancer. "Chemotherapy and radiation destroys platelets, and it can be a problem if there are no platelets

available for transfusions."

"Platelet donors are always welcome," Peterson said. "One donation can be miraculous and can save lives."
