

Kalkhof stymies Phoenix in Tar Heel win

If North Carolina pitcher Adam Kalkhof keeps pitching like he did Tuesday, Coach Mike Fox might have a problem, one he wouldn't mind having.

Kalkhof pitched 7.1 innings in his longest and strongest outing of the year as the Tar Heels defeated Elon 3-2 at Boshamer Stadium.

Kalkhof sat out most of March because of tendinitis in his pitching shoulder, but the sophomore lefthander has started to regain the form that made him one of UNC's most dependable starters last season.

After Kalkhof picked up his first win of the year last week in pitching five innings against UNC-Charlotte, he shut down Elon (18-22), yielding four hits and one earned run.

"Adam, I thought, was exceptional," Fox said. "He got in some tough spots but came back and

threw some good pitches. It's encouraging to see him out there."

After giving up the lone run on a two-out single in the top of the fifth inning, Kalkhof retired the final eight batters he faced.

But for now, the preseason All-ACC selection will stick to his mid-week outings because the weekend starters — Daniel Bard, Garry Bakker and Andrew Miller — have been so solid up to this point.

"The other three guys have been pitching very well," said Kalkhof, who struck out five batters. "Whatever happens, happens. I just need to go out and pitch as well as I can during the week."

But while an abundance of qualified starting pitchers is a great problem for Fox to have, his team's inability to put runners across the plate is one he'd prefer not to see at this point in the year.

UNC (28-10) stranded a whopping 34 runners in three games against Clemson this weekend, and the problems continued Tuesday.

Although the Tar Heels only left five runners on base, they failed to

capitalize on several opportunities to put away the Phoenix.

With North Carolina leading 1-0 thanks to Brack Massey's first career home run, Marshall Hubbard led off the third with a double. Back-to-back walks loaded the bases and chased Elon starter Kory Radford from the game.

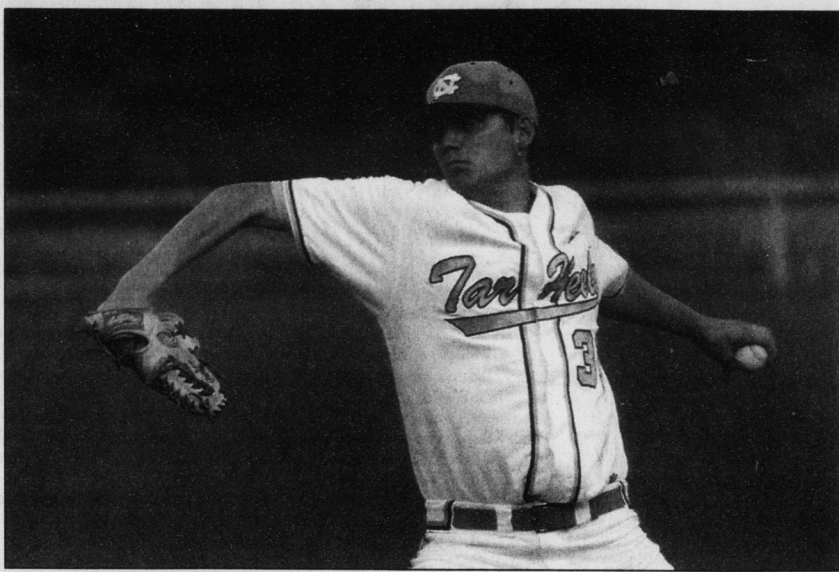
Elon brought in Justin Weeks, who came into the game sporting a ghastly 27.00 ERA and allowing opponents to hit .529 off him.

But Weeks escaped the jam when he got Wes Moyer to ground into a double play and Greg Mangum to pop out to left field, holding UNC to just one run.

The following inning, the Tar Heels put runners on the corners with one out, but a strikeout by Mike Daniel and a groundout by Hubbard ended that threat.

"That was a little painful to watch offensively," Fox said. "We just didn't get it done."

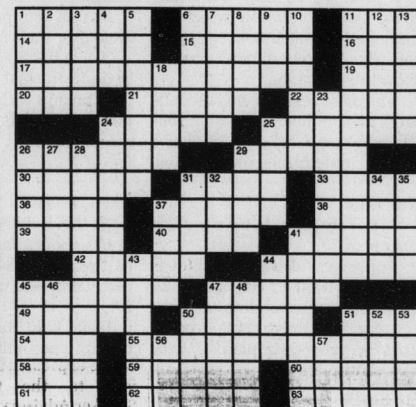

Clarett ruling on hold indefinitely

NEW YORK — Maurice Clarett is facing another major obstacle on his way to the NFL.

The 2nd U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals on Monday put on hold a lower-court decision to allow the former Ohio State star and other athletes to be eligible for this week-end's draft.

The appeals court said it stayed the earlier ruling to safeguard the NFL from harm and to ensure a more thorough review. Its final

opinion probably will be issued after the draft, perhaps weeks from now. Players are barred from the NFL until three years after high school graduation under league rules.

If a subsequent ruling makes Clarett eligible, the NFL could hold a supplemental draft, something it has done for players who entered the draft late since 1977, said NFL lawyer Gregg A. Levy.

The ruling came on the same day Southern California receiver Mike Williams filed his own law-

suit in federal court in Manhattan, saying the NFL had issued conflicting statements about eligibility for the draft, thus causing him to sacrifice his college career.

But Williams' college coach, Pete Carroll, said it was possible the wide receiver could return to school.

"Nothing definitive has been declared by the NCAA," Carroll said. "Some steps would have to be taken for the players to get back into college football."
