SBP candidates get early start on careers

Successful candidates for student body president begin planning their campaigns early in their careers at UNC.

Many make connections, consider platform planks and rise through the ranks of student government — all in a quest to garner the most votes come Election Day in February.

The formal campaign period doesn't begin until January, and the Student Code does not regulate informal campaign preparations for student government members before they officially declare their candidacy in January.

Students who intend to run for because different circumstances,

the presidency must resign from student government positions before the mandatory candidates' meeting, as stipulated in Title VI

of the Student Code.

The stipulation is intended to prevent conflict of interest and to prevent candidates from having an advantage during formal campaigns, said Walker Rutherfurd, chairman of the Board of Elections.

Student Body President Matt Calabria said he plans to call for members of his cabinet to resign if they intend to run for the presidency in the spring but doesn't think new policies should be adopted to regu-late campaign planning periods. "I don't think it is a big problem

Seth Dearmin, co-chairman of the Public Service and Advocacy Committee and a potential student body president candidate, said he has more experience with student government but does not think a

more stringent policy is necessary. Dearmin said he thinks it's tough for potential candidates who are active in student government to decide between retaining their roles or campaigning for the presidency.

Another potential candidate, Seke Ballard, executive assistant to the student body vice president and student appointee to the Faculty Council, said he doesn't see any real conflict of interest during

interests and goals occur each a campaign.

He added that he doesn't think

He added that he doesn't think he has an advantage by serving on student government.

"Information is more accessible as a member of student government," Ballard said. "But there are no real obstacles to find this information. If anyone commits time to find it, it's there."

Tom Jensen and Lizz Gregory, both potential candidates who are not active in student government, said they think student government members who plans to run for president or work on a campaign should resign as soon as they reach that decision.

"They have information about what student government is doing

that others don't," Jensen said. "I think it's best for an even playing

Jensen said that in the past, potential candidates resigned from office by late October and that hopefuls should follow this precedent.

Gregory's campaign manager, Ginny Franks, resigned from her post as executive assistant to the student body treasurer Oct. 19, the same day she accepted the new position.

Franks said resignation decisions are personal and should reside between student government administrators and the individual.

"I wanted to avoid conflict of interest because my involvement was going to be at such a high level," she said.

Leigha Blackwell, a member of the Chancellor's Committee for Student Awards and former member of Student Congress, said she

sees both sides of the issue. She said that while she doesn't think any legislative changes need to be made, she said she thinks efforts to make sure candidates know the

rules in place might be beneficial to a smooth election process. "It's definitely good to have that past experience and (know) how student government works," she said. "But it's also good to have that fresh perspective coming in with an outsider's point of view.


