Dawson keys Tournament wins UNC squanders lead in final

WINSTON-SALEM - In her 150th minute of ACC Tournament field hockey, Rachel Dawson was

Protecting a two-goal lead in the final minute of North Carolina's victory against Maryland in the final, Dawson deftly maneuvered

between Terrapin forwards.

Fittingly, she smashed the ball downfield as time expired, clinching the Tar Heels' first ACC title since 1997.

Dawson, a midfielder, was on the field for every second of the tour-nament — two full games and 10 minutes of overtime against Wake Forest — willing the Tar Heels to victory with her emotional and fre-

netic play.
But Dawson said fatigue did not enter her mind.

"I don't think about that because as soon as I let the exhaustion come into my brain, it is like I have already beaten myself," Dawson said. "Like Coach (Karen) Shelton says, 'Separate your mind from your body.' I think I kind of feed off of that."

Shelton said Dawson is so important that she hates to take the sophomore out of the game.

"Rachel is a great player, and her play is absolutely vital to our team's success," Shelton said. "She plays both sides of the ball — offense and defense - and we ask an awful lot

Dawson probably did more than she was asked during the weekend, registering three key assists as well as taking charge of the midfield.

In overtime against Wake on Friday, she took a free hit from the top of the circle that was tipped

"It's exhilarating," Dawson said after Friday's game. "There's no other feeling like it that I've experienced vet. It became like do or die."

Dawson once again assisted on the game-winner Sunday. She fired a long pass through two Maryland defenders that found Keeran on the sideline, who rushed to the goal and slid the ball into the net for UNC's second goal of the day. Then, with five and a half min-

utes to play, Dawson flipped the ball to Laura Douglas, who fired it into the goal. The score gave the Tar Heels a 3-1 lead that was too much for the Terps to overcome.

"I think Wake Forest put a lot of pressure on us, and it required a diving, valiant effort to stop them,"

After a 20-1 season and a title in the toughest conference in the country, Dawson said the team still needs to improve.

"I don't think we connected (on passes) as well as we can," she said. "It's kind of inspiring to know that we can compete so hard and win on heart and hustle. Just imagine where we can go when everything starts to click."

The North Carolina volleyball team dropped a five-game decision irginia Tech on Saturday night in Blacksburg, Va., 28-30, 30-27, 22-30, 30-27, 15-13.

Senior Katie Wright had a .361 hitting percentage and finished with 17 kills, while senior Molly Pyles tallied 15 kills and 27 digs to lead the Tar Heels.

The first two games were back-and-forth affairs, as neither team led by more than five in either frame.

After digging out of an early hole, UNC (16-12, 9-5 in the ACC) would not trail again and took the first game 30-28 on an attack error by Katie Esbrook.

The second game was even closer, as the Hokies (13-13, 7-7) never led by more than three, with that lead coming at the end of the 30-27

victory to even the match at one.

UNC appeared to seize the momentum in game three, when the Tar Heels put the game away with a 9-0 run to take a two games to one lead. Junior Dani Nyenhuis put away the final two points to secure the 30-22 win.

Virginia Tech took a 25-22 lead into the late stages of the game four before a 3-0 run tied the score. But two kills by Colette Ramirez gave the game to the Hokies, 30-27, and

forced a fifth game.

The Tar Heels got within four points of taking the match before Virginia Tech put together a final run to overtake UNC.

A kill by Annie Spicer capped a 5-0 run that turned an 11-6 UNC lead into a tie, and the hosts scored nine of the final 11 points of the match to win, 15-13.
