How to Get Started

GO ONLINE! From our main web page, http://studyabroad.unc.edu, click on "Find a Program" to research where our programs are located. Attend a "Study Abroad 101" information session. Schedule an appointment with an advisor: click on "Meet the Advisors" and "How to Find Us" if you've never been to the office before.

Exchange Programs

UNC-Chapel Hill, through the Study Abroad Office, has agreements with selected institutions around the world that make it possible for many students to study abroad at these institutions while paying their tuition/fees here at Carolina. All programs have GPA eligibility requirements and some have language, major, and/or a requirement that you be at least a Junior. So it's important to read all the information provided on the individual Study Abroad program brochure online. You can search for these programs via our website, http://studyabroad.unc.edu. Just click on "Find a program" to search for exchange programs. Obviously, this is a plus for instate students. For out-of-state students, many non-exchange program costs are lower than out-of-state tuition at UNC-CH. When exploring any program, be sure to click on "budget sheet" from any program brochure, to get an estimate of the cost of attendance for that program, and to see whether the program is "exchange or non-exchange". When you meet with an advisor, be sure to ask about costs.
