## Man charged in slew of crimes Bush names 1st U.S.

ATM arrest leads to chain of warrants

A man arrested in Raleigh on Wednesday for trying to make one too many illegal ATM withdrawals has now been connected to more than 20 crimes in Chapel Hill, according to local authorities.

Eugene Cameron Flint, 22, of 1818 Gorman St. A, in Raleigh, was arrested at 1:30 a.m. at the RBC Center while attempting to break into an ATM inside the arena.

Now both Chapel Hill police and the UNC Department of Public Safety have sent charges to Raleigh to be served on Flint by the Wake County Sheriff's Department.

DPS issued 19 separate war-rants on Flint on Thursday, including two related to an ATM stolen from Carmichael Auditorium and three related to ATMs that were robbed in the Smith Center, said DPS spokesman Randy Young.

The other 14 warrants issued by DPS are related to incidents in and around Woollen Gym, Fetzer Gym and other recreational complexes, he said.

Most of the incidents involved larcenies of wallets, phones and other personal property.

DPS warrants will include both misdemeanor and felony charges.

Stolen ATMs are valued at the scene, police reports state.

That ATM was later found by \$4,000, plus the cash that was inside, he said.

Chapel Hill police have sent state. charges in connection with two separate incidents in the town - an ATM stolen from Bruegger's Bagels in Eastgate Shopping Center and a stolen check cashed at the Carolina Central Bank in University Square, said police spokeswoman Jane Cousins.

Flint will be charged with felonious breaking and entering, felonious larceny, damage to property, possession of burglary tools and financial identity fraud, Cousins said.

The ATM was stolen from Eastgate at about 2:30 a.m. Feb. 7 when a Bruegger's store window was smashed by a hammer left at

len check Jan. 18, reports state. Flint is being held in Wake County Jail on a \$10,000 secured bond stemming from his charges in

Chapel Hill, Cousins said. He was charged with breaking and entering by Raleigh police for smashing a window to gain access to the RBC Center, said spokesman Jim Sughrue.

Flint will also be charged for incidents in Chatham County, Young said.

## intelligence director

WASHINGTON, D.C. -President Bush on Thursday named John Negroponte, a former U.S. ambassador to the United Nations and currently the administration's top representative in Iraq, to be America's first national intelligence director.

Announcing the move, Bush said that Negroponte understands global intelligence needs because he's had a long career in the foreign service. Bush said he wants Negroponte to be his clearinghouse for intelligence and to make decisions on the intelligence budgets for 15 government agencies.

"John will make sure that those whose duty it is to defend America have the information we need to make the right decisions," the president said.

Negroponte said if confirmed he plans to "reform of the intelligence community in ways designed to best meet the intelligence needs

of the 21st century."

Discussing the authority that Negroponte will have, Bush said that "people who control the money, people who have access to the president generally have a lot of influence. And that's why John Negroponte is going to have a lot of influence. He will set the bud-


