■ A 20-year-old UNC student was arrested at 2:51 a.m. Friday and charged with driving while intoxicated, provisional license violation and reckless driving, Chapel Hill police report state.

According to reports, Lemuel Lewis Burnham, of 109 Muirfield Court in Moorestown, N.J., was seen driving recklessly on East Rosemary Street. Officers pulled over the black 2002 Chevrolet Silverado pickup that he was driving at 150 W. Rosemary St., reports state.

He was released on a written promise to appear April 26 in Orange County District Criminal Court in Chapel Hill.

■ Two University students were cited at 1:40 a.m. Friday for aiding and abetting underage drinking, Chapel Hill police reports state.

According to reports, officers responded to a party at 6 Bolin Heights, where underage drinkers were congregated.

Two residents of the house — junior Elizabeth Renee Jones, 20, and sophomore Kathryn M. Stuver, 20 — were charged with aiding their delinquency.

Both are scheduled to appear April 29 in Orange County District Criminal Court in Chapel Hill.

■ Three men were cited for marijuana possession after a traffic stop at 11:07 p.m. Friday on U.S. 15-501, Chapel Hill police reports state.

Desmond Rashawn Alston, 20, of 207 Pinegate Circle 3, ran a red light in a blue 1986 Lincoln, reports state.

He was charged with having a 0.6-gram marijuana cigarette, reports state. Two passengers — Joshua Maurice Jones, 22, of 106 N. Elliot Road A-5, and Theodore S. Farrington, 19, of 609 Park Avenue B in Durham — each were charged with possessing at least 1 gram of the substance, reports state.

Alston is scheduled to appear May 3 in Orange County District Criminal Court in Chapel Hill. Jones and Farrington are scheduled to appear May 2 in Orange County District Criminal Court in Hillsborough.

■ A 20-year-old Eastern Carolina University student was arrested at 9:49 a.m. Saturday and charged with possession of marijuana, possession of drug paraphernalia, driving while intoxicated, provisional

license violation, speeding and signal violation — all misdemeanors — Chapel Hill police reports state.

According to reports, Kyle Phillip Radack, of 1002 Forbes St. in Greenville, was observed on Pittsboro Street speeding and driving in the wrong lane of travel, almost causing an accident.

His blood-alcohol content was measured at 0.08 and 0.07 on the Intoxilyzer 5000, reports state.

■ A Waffle House assistant manager was arrested at 5 p.m. Saturday on felony financial fraud warrants from New Hanover City, Chapel Hill police reports state.

According to reports, Randy Scott Woodall, of 120 Daniel Boone Lane 4 in Hillsborough, was arrested at 210 S. Estes Drive for 13 felony counts of financial fraud.

The charges stem from five outstanding warrants from the Carolina Beach Police Department.

Woodall was released on a written promise to appear at the first opportunity Tuesday in Wilmington.

Crowd dives into lakes

Boaters and fishers alike took advantage of the reopening of local lakes Saturday — despite the cold weather and overcast skies.

University Lake and the Cane Creek Reservoir, which reopened for the season, are the biggest sources of water in the area and are popular places for people to fish, canoe, picnic and just relax.

Even with the absence of picnickers and others who might have been deterred by the dismal weather conditions at University Lake, the turnout was almost as high as expected.

"It's been pretty busy," said Assistant Lake Warden Brandon Linthicum.

"Everyone who was kicked out during the winter and regular customers can come back."

More than 80 people came out for the reopening, he estimated.

Bruce Urashima, a Hawaiian native living in the area, said fishing at the lake gave his 4-year-old son, Chas, an opportunity to experience what he did as a child.

"We come four times a year to let him fish," Urashima said of his son.

"We come primarily to fish, sometimes rent a boat, just anything to make it an adventure for my son."

Chas, who said he's gone fishing

many times, explored the rocky shoreline while "fishing."

Many boaters and fishers, undeterred by the chilly weather, said the overcast skies were better, especially for fishing.

"Your hands get cold, but otherwise you're fine," said Fred Dixon of Chapel Hill. He added that he came to the lake mostly to relax and get away from home.

Michigan natives Kevin Merrill and Dave Monroe said they thoroughly enjoyed the weather.

"The weather is great, much better than snow and warmer than Michigan," Merrill said.

But while some said the cold weather would not affect fishing conditions, others were less optimistic.

"Cold weather slows down fishing a lot," said Cary resident Jeff Kullely, though he added that the lake in general seems good for bass

fishing.

Linthicum said that the lake usually sees fewer people on rainy days, but that the numbers will double during midsummer, when weather conditions improve.

Fees for most lake equipment, including boats, were waived Saturday in honor of Lightning Brown, a former board member of the Orange Water and Sewer Authority who died of AIDS.

University Lake, located in Carrboro off Jones Ferry Road, is open from 6:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. Friday through Monday.

Cane Creek Reservoir, located off N.C. 54 about eight miles from Carrboro Plaza, is open from 6:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. Thursday through Saturday and from 1 p.m. to 6 p.m. Sunday.
