felony charges of assault with the intent to kill and inflict serious injury, and felony charges of breaking and entering, reports state. He also was arrested on misdemeanor charges of second degree trespassing, reports state.

dent occurred Friday when Burton entered the home of a friend and began to threaten her with a knife. He was held in lieu of \$10,000 bail and was scheduled to make his first appearance in court Tuesday.

Animal Planet aired a tribute to him Tuesday after he was killed by a stingray Monday. Discovery's headquarters in Silver Spring, Md., soon will be home to "The Steve Irwin Sensory Memorial Garden."

Discovery also will create the Steve Irwin Crocodile Hunter Fund to support wildlife conservation, Irwin's zoo in Beerwah, Australia, and the education of his children, Bindi, 8, and Bob, 2. Discovery will refer to it affectionately as "The Crikey Fund."

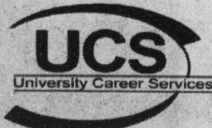
