Failed brew spells lawsuit

On Monday, a German court ordered a self-described witch to refund a disappointed client her hefty fee for a spell that failed to win back the woman's partner.

The client paid the witch \$1,275 to bring back her ex-boyfriend, who left her in 2003. The Munich administrative court said the witch offered a service that was "objectively completely impossible."

"The defendant carried out the corresponding ritual over several months, each time under a full moon, but without success," a court statement said.
