Incidents of breaking and entering and larceny were reported at 12:26 p.m. Saturday, according to Chapel Hill police reports.

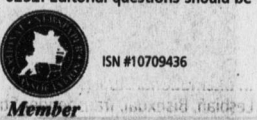
Reports state a set of custom golf clubs, valued at \$2,000, was taken from an open garage at 904 Pinehurst Drive.

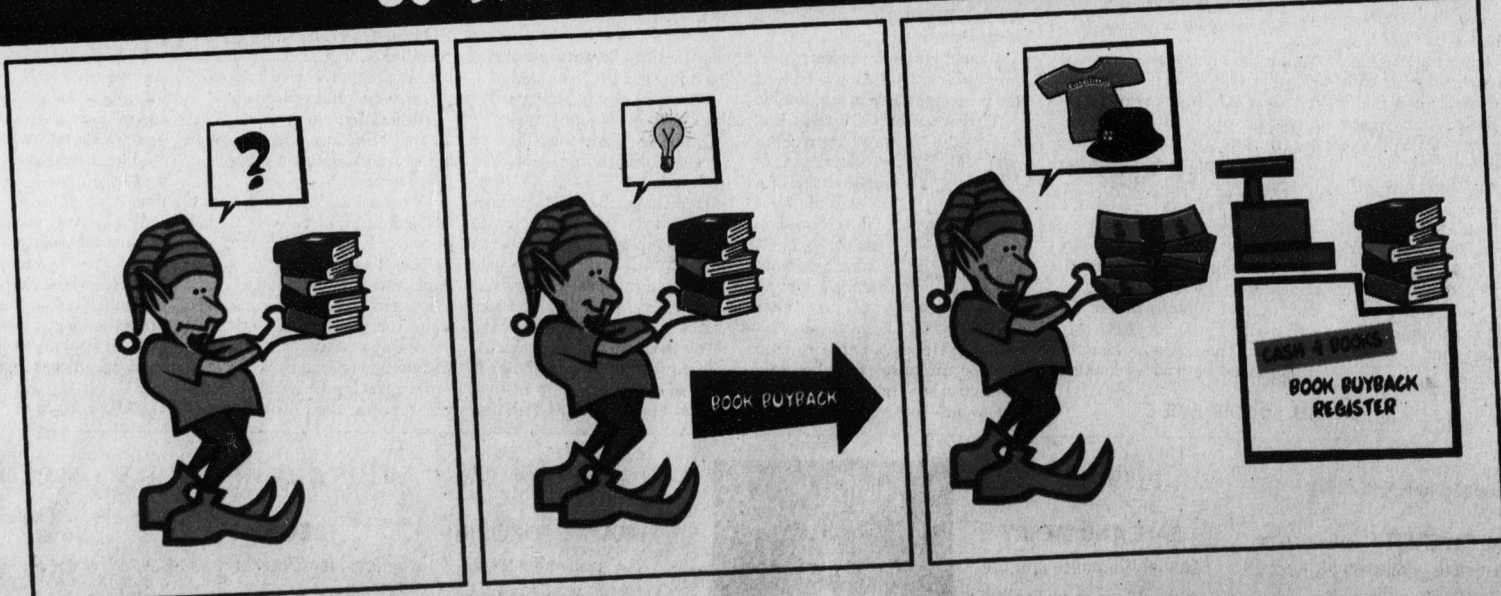
