

Tar Heels dominate No. 31 Volunteers, 6-1

The No. 8 North Carolina women's tennis team (5-0) thought of its matchup with Tennessee (0-1) as a test.

It passed with flying colors, winning 6-1 Wednesday night at the Cone-Kenfield Tennis Center.

The Tar Heels were victorious in all three of the doubles matches to win the first point of the contest.

"I was really impressed with our doubles," coach Brian Kalbas said. "They were consistent, and I think we caught them a little on their heels."

No. 7 ranked singles player Jenna Long defeated No. 12 Blakey Griffith in straight sets 6-2, 7-5. Long's win clinched the match for the Tar Heels, having earned the fourth point needed to secure the victory.

Both Long and Griffith are seniors, so they have seen a lot of each other throughout their collegiate careers.

"She makes a lot of good balls," Long said of her opponent. "I just came out really strong in the first set and tried not to lose focus."

Freshman Katrina Tsang was able to keep her composure and show that focus was not an issue, even after dropping the first set.

Ranked No. 19 in the country, Tsang was able to defeat Tennessee's Ghizela Schutte 2-6, 6-1, 6-3.

"I got out on a shaky start in the first set," Tsang said. "I'm not quite match tough yet. I was beating myself with errors, and I just needed to loosen up."

Because a third set was needed to determine the winner in Tsang's case, all eyes were on the center court at the end.

"It was an experience," Tsang said. "Seeing my teammates on the side is great because I'm not only representing myself but my school and my team, as well."

Kalbas was pleased with the women's performance because they will be facing a tough matchup on the road with No. 2 Florida on Sunday.

"Florida will be gearing up for us," Kalbas said. "Playing this good of a match early in the season gives us a slight advantage."

WINSTON-SALEM — North Carolina guard Ty Lawson is known for his blistering speed and whipping passes.

But coach Roy Williams also knows he has a sweet shooting touch, and UNC 88 Wake Forest 60 Wednesday's game against Wake Forest, Williams told the freshman they needed a big half out of him.

Lawson didn't hold back and scored all 15 of his points in the final period as he and fellow freshman Wayne Ellington (18) led the Tar Heels to an 88-60 win against the Demon Deacons at Lawrence Joel Coliseum.

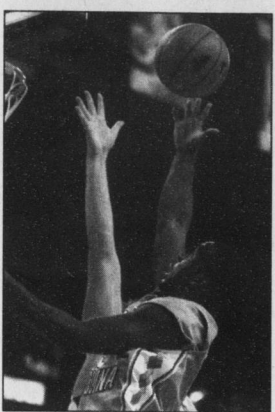
"I've been talking to him a little more recently about not ignoring his shot because he can shoot the basketball," Williams said. "I think sometimes he looks past that, which is great to have a point guard which looks (to) pass first, but don't ignore your open

shots. But I did tell him that we needed a big half out of him."

It was the largest UNC win ever in Winston-Salem, with the previous high being a 79-53 victory on Jan. 22, 1987.

Even though the final score wasn't close, the Tar Heels (18-2, 5-1) couldn't shake the pesky Demon

Deacons in the first half, thanks in large part to center Kyle Visser and guard Ishmael Smith, who combined for 18 first-half points. Although UNC shot 56.7 percent in the first half, it went into halftime with only a 42-37 advantage.

But in the second half a rested Lawson — he only played nine minutes in the first period due to foul trouble — ignited the UNC offense with a free throw, 3-pointer and layup, which began a 19-8 run to put the game out of reach for Wake Forest (9-10, 1-6).

"They kinda lost confidence (in the second half)," said sophomore Danny Green, who finished with 12 points.

"They weren't coming after us as they did in the first half. They weren't hitting all the shots they made in the first half. We started pressuring more, we started getting easier baskets, fast-break layups. They were getting tired."

UNC capitalized on 10 steals and 19 Demon Deacon turnovers by scoring 25 points on the fast break.

"We was running up and down the court (in the second half)," Lawson said. "They was having a half court game in the first half, so in the second half we was just run-

ning up and down the court, which also got me open a little bit more."

The Tar Heels held Wake Forest to 32.4 percent from the floor, and as a team the Demon Deacons went 5-for-16 from the foul line. Visser was the only Demon Deacon to score in double figures (16) and Smith (9) fouled out with six minutes to play.

"We missed a lot of open looks," said Wake Forest coach Skip Prosser. "They weren't guarding us at the foul line, that I can remember, and we shot worse there than when we did from the field. I really give them credit."
