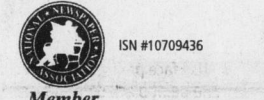

Clinton terrorizes nation

Hillary Clinton is atop another poll: She's the No. 1 choice for the major 2008 presidential candidate who would make the scariest Halloween costume. Thirty-seven percent in an Associated Press-Ipsos survey this month chose the New York senator, the front-runner among Democratic contenders. Fourteen percent selected former New York Mayor Rudy Giuliani, who leads Republicans in national polls.

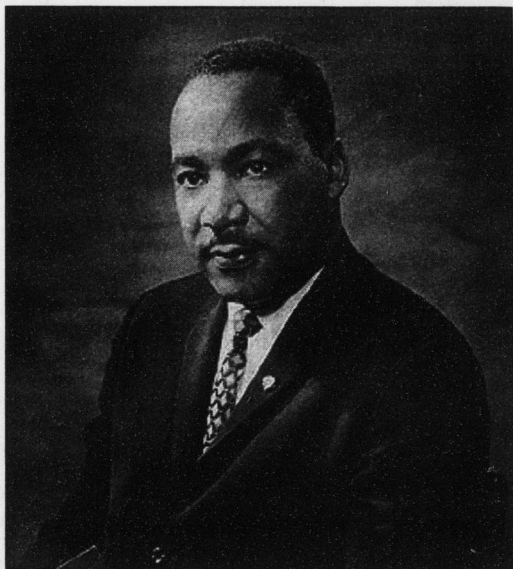
People dug through the wall and stole \$1,200 and credit card receipts, causing \$500 worth of damage to the wallboard, reports state.
