 ■ Jack Johnson, 19, was arrested at 4:40 p.m. Monday on the charge of failing to appear in court, according to Chapel Hill Police reports.


Johnson was taken to the Orange County Jail in lieu of \$300 bond, reports state.

Lozada also was charged with underage drinking, and Detter was also charged with driving while intoxicated, reports state.
