Sitter charged with giving child weed FROM STAFF AND WIRE REPORTS

n 18-year-old man from Michigan has pleaded guilty to giving a 3-year-old a marijuana cigarette, but because of a plea deal, he will only get probation, WDIV News in Detroit reported.

Filipe Garcia was originally charged with felony child abuse after investigators found a videotape of the child smoking marijuana and cigarettes while Garcia was babysitting. But because prosecutors could not prove beyond a doubt the substance in the video was marijuana, Garcias was allowed to plea a misdemeanor charge.

Police said that they are concerned with the plea deal and that there is major concern over the safety of the child. "How's that child going to grow up? Will he grow up smoking anything? It's gonna be tough," police Chief Robert Alderman said.


The window, which was spraypainted, was valued at \$50, according to police reports.


