5. Student life

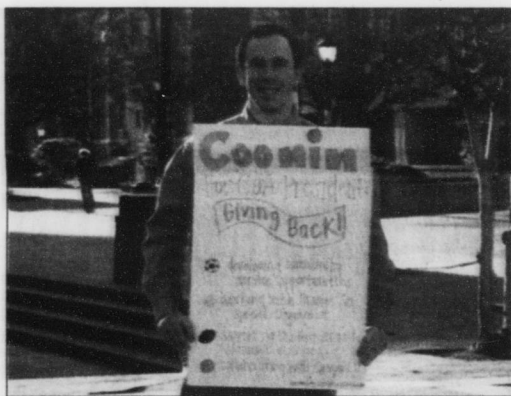
I want to improve student life by promoting collaboration among student groups, bringing more art to campus, adding late night dining and so much more.

2. Diversity

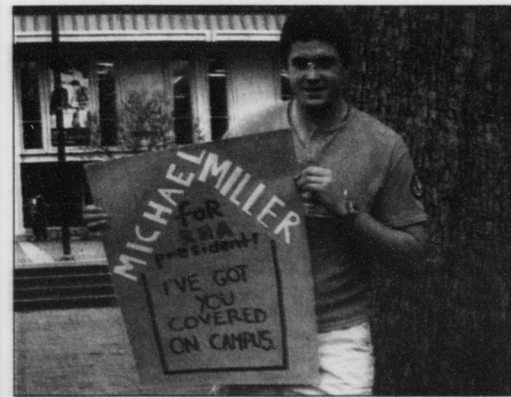
