"We inverted the price structure so that the more water you buy, the more expensive it becomes," Chapel Hill Mayor Kevin Foy said. "Our conservation is not just a response to the drought."

Foy said Chapel Hill took a proactive approach after 2002, when Cane Creek Reservoir water levels fell below full for the first spring since it was filled in 1989.

But the conservation efforts may not be enough without more drastic restrictions.

"If, over the next three-month period, we had 13 to 16 inches of rain, it would not end the drought, but it would ameliorate it," Miller said, adding there is only a 15 to 20 percent chance of that happening.

It's typical that reservoirs are drawn down in summer and fall, and they fill up in winter," Kerwin said. "What's alarming is that they aren't refilling."

Foy said conservation efforts will probably increase as the drought continue

"It takes a while for a community to become aware of something as insidious as a drought," he said

Kerwin said water usage, while lower in December, increased in January before decreasing as of

Carrboro Mayor Mark Chilton aid Carrboro residents are doing what they can to conserve.

"I think people understand it's serious situation we're facing, and lots of people in Carrboro are trying to implement conservation measures in their homes, which I think is really good," Chilton said.
But he said that OWASA is most

effective at enforcing conservation and that they should vote to move into Stage 3 restrictions. He said the reservoirs aren't filling

up at a rate that allows for optimism, and more serious conservation should start now rather than later.

"I think Stage 3 is what needs to happen — it's not raining nearly enough."

Perucci said "Double Indemnity's" heroes are "not - like (noir pioneer) Raymond Chandler's

eroes — the masculine savior." And once Neff falls in love with housewife Dietrichson, they plan an insurance-scam murder, which risks everything.

Jarman, who plays the most hap-less of the Neffs, said he believes the gender roles in film noir come from a reaction to "the new roles that vomen moved into in World War II," which he attributed to a misogynistic tendency in many noirs.

"Men are essentially helpless," Jarman said.

Dietrichson exemplifies the femme fatale archetype, particular-ly the persona played by sophomore Maria Facelli. Facelli also plays Phyllis' daughter, Lola Dietrichson. who becomes a pivotal character

after a shocking turn of events.

The black-and-white set features oversized stock market charts, putting the actors in a stylized environment. Stark lighting pervades the play, and a movie screen sits in the middle of the stage, showing pieces of the film and original footage.

"Film noir's roots lie in German

Expressionist film of the silent era," Perucci said. "The piece intends to return to those roots, rather than replicate the naturalism of noir acting; the physicality expresses the mood, feeling or conflict at any moment."

Cecilia Durbin designed the lighting, which includes more than 120 different lighting cues. Traditionally, film noir uses lighting more expressively than other genres, and Durbin said she was able to play with those aspects and use them to good effect.

Despite faithful 1940s costumes,

the production does not restrict itself to Roosevelt-era culture. While some of the movie's score is present, The Velvet Underground's "Femme Fatale" makes an appearance, as does a Jimi Hendrix cover.

"We live in a noir era," Perucci said, explaining that he sees the genre surviving best today with directors such as Joel and Ethan Coen, who directed 2007's "No Country for Old Men."

"The Coen brothers are in the James M. Cain mold, where the protagonist is corrupted, weak and even a bit of a loser," he said.
