"America is a melting pot," he said. "So the children have to know the whole world." Other Korean families members


distributed gimbap, a sushi-like dish, and kimchi, a type of fermented vegetable.



"The typical single family resi-dential household averaged about 6,000 gallons of water per month before 2002, and since the drought in 2002, the average has been about 5,500 per month," he said.

Marcoplos said the current drought has similar characteristics.

"It is just another year when we didn't recharge the reservoir dur-ing the winter," Marcoplos said. He said the only difference this

time around is that OWASA is better prepared while other jurisdictions look like they are finally getting it.

Rain helped to end the 2002 drought, but it's unclear when this one might end. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration is predicting an ongoing drought with me improvement. "We don't know how it's going to

end," Marcoplos said. "It's uncharted territory.
