California school provides 'higher' ed

For \$200 and two required textbooks, students at Oaksterdam University, a new Oakland, Calif., trade school, can learn how to cultivate cannabis, which strains of pot are best for certain ailments and what the legalities are of a business that is legal in California but against the law in the eyes of the federal government.

"My basic idea is to try to professionalize the industry and have it taken seriously as a real industry, just like beer and distilling hard alcohol," said Richard Lee, 45, a pot-dispensary owner who founded the school and its two-day course in the fall.

Sixty students have completed the course. Some students said they enrolled because they were curious, others because they wanted tips for growing their own weed.

After 12 hours of preparation and baking, the 134-pound Absolutely Ridiculous Burger emerged, made with beef, bacon and cheese and delivered on a 50-pound bun.

It sells for \$350, and orders require 24 hours' notice. Flipping the burger required three men.

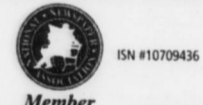
