Wilkes County, where he had an outstanding warrant for failure to appear on charges of speeding 95 mph in a 65 mph zone, driving with a suspended license and reck less driving to endanger.

He was released from jail on Feb. 20. Four days later, he was arrested for trespassing in the Rams Head parking deck at UNC.

Campus groups have been asked to notify DPS if they see Sweet on campus so they can arrest him.

But Sweet said that the Wilkes County charges stemmed from speeding tickets for which he was not notified of a court date and that the trouble on campus came because of false allegations of harassment.

"I assume it's because I'm vocal, and if they don't want to hear about Christ, it'll make them mad," he said. He added that he might file civil lawsuits against several University community members who he said have created a negative image of him. Sweet received a bachelor's

degree in journalism and religion at Penn State University, then earned a master's degree in divin-ity in church leadership at Liberty University. He had expected to preach at a church.

But he said he couldn't find peace. So he gave away his posse prayed and came to UNC.
