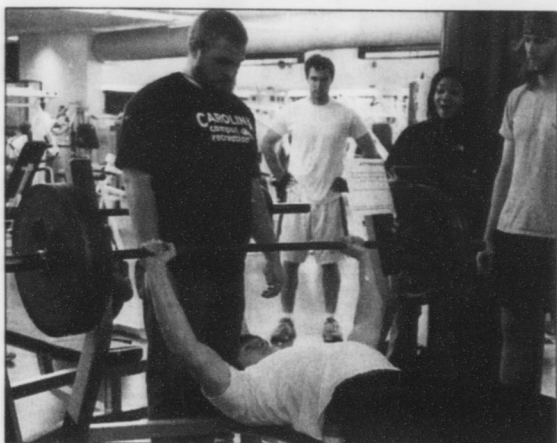

Courts buzzing after attack with wasps

California resident Angela Nellany pleaded no contest to assault with a deadly weapon after allegedly trying to kill her estranged husband with a can of wasps, the Modesto Bee reported.
