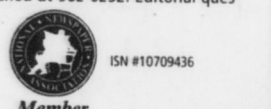

Police bust casino in home

Police said a man turned his house into a casino, with high-priced buy-ins, credit card machines and nudity.

William Shane Anderson and his wife, Laurie, both 37, were said to have gambling going on when children were in the house, and their mother, a stripper, helped run the business.

"She was also a dealer, and she would deal topless," said Middletown, Del., Police Chief Hank Tobin.
