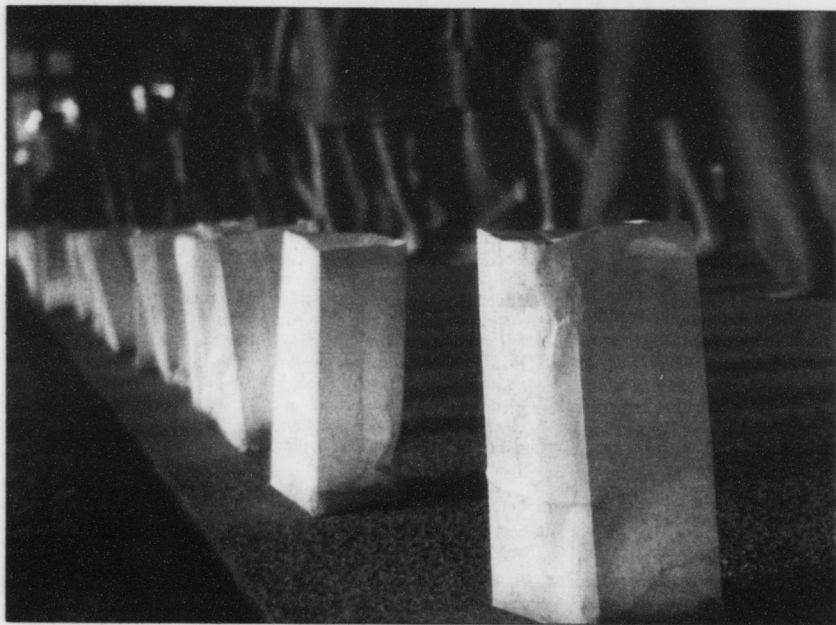

Members from each team take turns walking laps while others play games, watch performances and visit fundraising booths on the field.



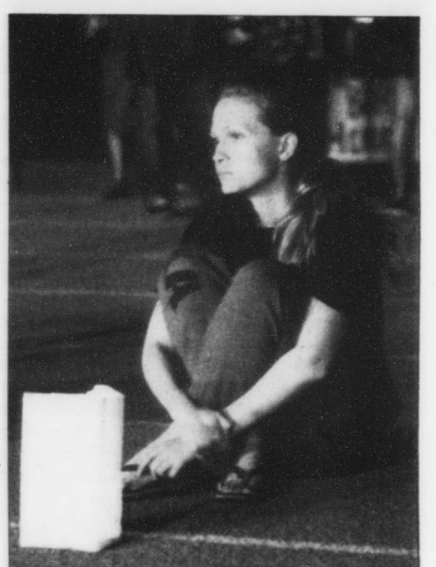

Nia Whol, 8, skips around the track with fellow cancer survivor and guest speaker Ginger Blakely.



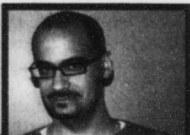
