Wurzelmann, founder of Alianza. Wurzelmann said he first became aware of farmworker issues after taking an APPLES trip to Eastern North Carolina and seeing pictures of Carlitos Candelario, the baby

born without arms or legs. Wednesday night, Alianza hosted "Border Stories," a compilation of photographs and narratives collected by Duke students who visited Tucson, Ariz., and Nogales, Mexico, to witness firsthand the problems that exist on both sides of the border.

"It's important to know these stories because they're people we're living with and don't see," said Duke senior Courtney Stull, who performed with the group. UNC junior Nysheria Sims, one of about 100 students at Wednesday's event, said she attended to gain understanding of the issue.

"It's not something that's talked about," she said. The Farm Labor Organizing Committee, a group of professional advocates, is also involved in the week. "The whole structure of the agricultural industry needs to be called into question, and workers need to

be able to have a voice and protections in their workplace without being afraid of losing their jobs," organizer Evan Hughes said. "That's what this week is all about." Hughes' group is coordinating Saturday's event, which will bring community members to guest

worker camps to share stories and experiences over a potluck dinner. "Fundamentally for me, it comes down to workers having a voice," he said. "Once that happens, they can decide what they want."

"We're going to have a conversation with the folks all across North Carolina," Hendrickson said. "We've created incredible energy across the state," he told the crowd, citing Clinton's recent trips to Raleigh, Fayetteville and Winston-Salem, and the overflow of people in attendance at those rallies.

"That's the kind of excitement Hillary Clinton is generating all across the state."

"We usually find at our office openings it's usually people who are eager to get involved with the campaign here," said Carly Lindauer, spokeswoman for the Raleigh office.

And that seemed to hold true, as people rushed forward at the end of the speakers' comments to put their names in phone bank slots, sign up to be head of a precinct and volunteer to collect campaign signs.

Elizabeth Henson, a long-time Clinton supporter, said she heard about the opening on the radio and decided to stop in.

"I've been waiting for some action to start so I could help."

Trujillo was fervent in his call for such volunteers, and his excitement quickly spread to the crowd.

"When we win North Carolina, it's going to be the biggest upset in American political history," he said, shouting over whistles and huge applause.

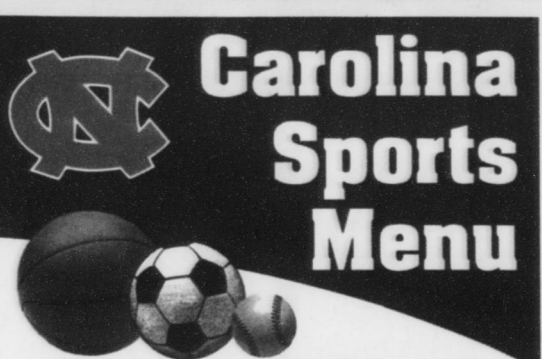

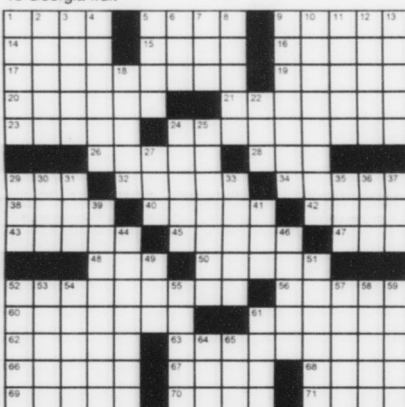
