"We usually find at our office openings it's usually people who are eager to get involved with the campaign here," said Carly Lindauer, spokeswoman for the Raleigh office.

And that seemed to hold true, as people rushed forward at the end of the speakers' comments to put their names in phone bank slots, sign up to be head of a precinct and volunteer to collect campaign signs.

Elizabeth Henson, a long-time Clinton supporter, said she heard about the opening on the radio and

decided to stop in. "I've been waiting for some action to start so I could help."

Trujillo was fervent in his call for such volunteers, and his excitement quickly spread to the crowd.

"When we win North Carolina, it's going to be the biggest upset in American political history," he said, shouting over whistles and huge applause.
