Junior Cara Ray from Boone is a transfer student from Wake Forest University and said she was homesick for her friends and family.


"I didn't really consider any other plans for the summer," Ray said.

"I will be traveling around the country to various music festivals, that's the one really good thing about the summer," Monroe said.


"I'm excited. I'll have so much free time to do things, and that's what summer's for."
