form is tuition talks, which Raynor has been working with the UNC Board of Trustees to improve, though she refused to release more details of her plan at this point.

Trustees will also see presentations concerning enrollment growth. The faculty-to-student ratio report by the audit and finance committee may shed light on any future accommodations.

The study is meant to show how many instructors would need to be added in order to accommodate increased numbers of students.

The UNC system is expected to grow by 40 percent — or 80,000 students — in the next decade. The University has already made preliminary plans to prepare for up to 33,000 students by 2017.

**Incoming freshman class loses member**

**Krysti Bullins dies at age 18**

As freshmen in the class of 2012 continue to attend orientation and gear up for their first semester at college, one of their fellow classmates will not have the chance to join them.

Krystian "Krysti" Bullins, 18, died the morning of July 7 at UNC Hospitals due to liver, kidney and respiratory failure.

Bullins was a recent graduate of John Motley Morehead High School in Eden. She was close with her ninth grade English teacher and newspaper advisor of four years, Janet Ratliff.

Ratliff said that Bullins was very excited about attending UNC in the fall, and she and Bullins attended a journalism camp at the University last summer.

"It was her dream to be going to UNC," she said. "She was getting ready to start; she was getting ready for dorm life when this happened."

Ratliff said that Bullins' health problems arose from a liver transplant she had ten years ago which created reoccurring problems and caused her to be in the hospital for more than 300 days of her life.

Even though Bullins missed much of her schooling due to her health problems, Ratliff said, "She was an excellent student, very driven and very motivated."

She added that not only did Bullins keep up her GPA while in the hospital, she was also president of her school's chapter of the National Honor Society, editor of her school newspaper and had dreams of becoming a pediatrician.

"After all of her health problems and being in the hospital, she really wanted to work with children," Ratliff said.

Ratliff also said that Bullins not only excelled in school, but was also a "wonderful person."

"Despite her health problems she always had a positive outlook, was always cheerful and was always smiling," she said.

definitely be back."

Maris said the exhibit has cost the museum \$115,000 thus far, the bulk of which was raised through private donations.

KidZoom will be the last exhibit to appear at the museum's current location, until it raises the \$2 to \$3 million needed to build its expansion museum. The move will take place in two to three years.

"We have big aspirations," Maris said. "We want to become one of

the best children's community museums in the country.

"We also ultimately aspire to become a family education innovator in terms of how children learn."

But for now, Kidzu staff is focused on involving and inspiring the local community, Maris said.

"We are all about serving and reflecting our community, so it's such a wonderful opportunity to finally be able to have an exhibit dedicated to that."
