Incoming freshman class loses member

Krysti Bullins dies at age 18

As freshmen in the class of 2012 continue to attend orientation and gear up for their first semester at college, one of their fellow class-mates will not have the chance to join them.

Krystian "Krysti" Bullins, 18. died the morning of July 7 at UNC Hospitals due to liver, kidney and respiratory failure.

Bullins was a recent graduate of John Motley Morehead High School in Eden. She was close with her ninth grade English teacher and newspaper advisor of four years, Janet Ratliff.

Ratliff said that Bullins was very excited about attending UNC in the fall, and she and Bullins attended a journalism camp at the University last summer.

"It was her dream to be going to UNC," she said. "She was getting ready to start; she was getting ready for dorm life when this happened."

problems arose from a liver trans-plant she had ten years ago which created reoccurring problems and caused her to be in the hospital for more than 300 days of her life.

Even though Bullins missed much of her schooling due to her health problems, Ratliff said, "She was an excellent student, very driven and very motivated."

She added that not only did Bullins keep up her GPA while in the hospital, she was also president of her school's chapter of the National Honor Society, editor of her school newspaper and had dreams of becoming a pediatrician.

"After all of her health problems and being in the hospital, she really wanted to work with children, Ratliff said.

Ratliff also said that Bullins not only excelled in school, but was also a "wonderful person."

"Despite her health problems she always had a positive outlook, was always cheerful and was always


