POLICE LOG

■ Police arrested a Durham man Friday for carrying a concealed firearm and possessing marijuana and drug paraphernalia, according to Chapel Hill police reports.

Reports state that Jonathan Dangelo Hicks, a 41-year-old taxi driver, was stopped on Ephesus Church Road for a narcotics investigation when police found the firearm in his pocket and a small amount of marijuana.

Police released Hicks in lieu of \$1,000 bail, and he is expected in court Nov. 3, reports state.

■ More than \$12,000 in tools were stolen from an Environ Way construction site either Thursday or Friday, according to Chapel Hill police reports.

The tools included seven saws, three lasers, a hammer drill and a gasoline pump, reports state.

This was the second reported incident of theft from an Environ Way construction site in a week.

■ Someone scratched "whore" into the trunks of two cars parked at a Church Street home, according to Chapel Hill police reports.

It was reported Sunday that damage of \$300 was done to both a 2002 Volvo S60 and a 2005 Ford Mustang, possibly using a rock, reports state.

■ Police arrested a man and found a counterfeit crack rock in his pocket on North Graham Street on Sunday, according to Chapel Hill police reports.

■ Two men wrestled after a misunderstanding Saturday, according to Chapel Hill police reports.

Reports state that an iPod was found in the incident.

■ Police responded to a report of abandonment of a dog Friday at a house that was going to be burned as training for the fire department, according to Carrboro Police reports.

Reports state that firefighters reported a dog was tied to the house, but when police arrived, the officer could not find the dog. The officer found a leash that went under the door into the building. The officer heard no response when he knocked.
