### Cockroaches could take over Florida

University of Florida researchers are concerned that an increase of people raising insects as lizard food could lead to the creation of new varieties of cockroaches.

Researchers at UF's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences in Gainesville said the Turkestan cockroach is the biggest threat because it has gained a foothold in the southwestern United States after hitching a ride with U.S. military personnel and equipment returning from the Middle East.




