N.C. girl uses site name

A 19-year-old Asheville High graduate legally changed her name to cutoutdissection.com to protest animal cruelty. Jennifer Thornburg now insists on being called "Cutout."

"Whenever anyone asks for or reads my name, it sparks a conversation about the cruelty of dissection and about the modern, humane alternatives available," she said.

NOTED. A Vero Beach, Fla., customer at McDonald's was arrested after he tried to pay for his meal with marijuana.

The woman wrote down the truck's license plate but an officer could not locate the vehicle, reports state.

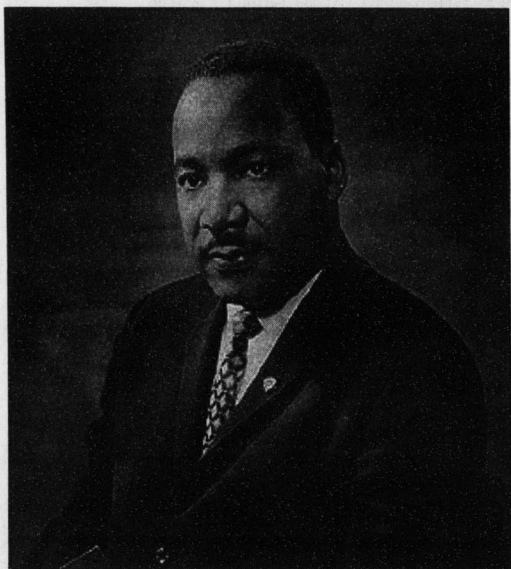
A man had four beers in his pocket when he walked up to a register to purchase other items, according to Carrboro police reports.
